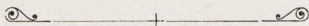

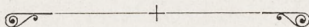

The Woman's Auxiliary of West Texas met in St. Mark's Church, San Antonio, Wednesday afternoon, May 16th, 1900.

This was the fifth of these annual gatherings, and in every way was felt to be the most encouraging and successful this Branch of the Auxiliary has had. The church was almost half filled with interested women, the Convocation remained in a body to the meeting, thus showing their appreciation of the importance and value of the work the women are trying to do, and their interest in it. There was an unusually large number of delegates present and seven new Branches were reported, making in all now twenty-one Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, and three of the Junior Auxiliary. We hope that by next Convocation every Parish and Mission in the jurisdiction will, in some way, be connected with the Auxiliary, and send either a delegate or written report to represent them at the annual meeting in May.

The afternoon was devoted to the Missionary Service, papers on "Systematic Giving" by Mrs. Galbraith, of Kerrville; a "Missionary Reading" by Miss Johnston, of San Antonio; "The True Missionary Spirit," by the Rev. A. W. S. Garden, of Cuero. The Offertory was used to complete the amount promised for the Bible Woman in China and for the Sendai Mission.
