The United Offering of 1916

Resolved: That the United Offering of 1916 be given to the Board of Missions for woman's work in the mission field, including the training, testing, sending and support of woman workers; also the care of such workers when sick or disabled; but that a sum not exceeding \$20,000 be devoted to buildings for the use of woman workers, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the mission field, or, if they can not go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

Minutes of the Twenty-First Annual Meeting

OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE BOARD OF MISSIONS

Held in Trinity Church, Morgantown, June 11, 1914.

The twenty-first annual meeting of West Virginia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Morgantown, June 11th, in the Sunday School room of the Methodist Church, which was kindly given us for the day.

The meeting was called to order by the President at 9:30 a. m., and after singing "The Morning Light is Breaking," the Rev. Mr. Gibbons had prayers.

The roll was then called and Clarksburg reported 3 present; Charles Town, 1; Fairmont, 6; Hedgesville, 1; New Martinsville, 1; Parkersburg, Good Shepherd, 1; Trinity, 2; Wheeling, St. Luke's 1; St. Matthew's, 2; Fairmont Juniors, 1; Morgantown Juniors, 1. Those present from the Morgantown Church could not be reported as they had no branch of the Auxiliary.

The minutes of the last meeting were then read by the Secretary, and the President delivered her annual address.

The President then announced the resignation of Miss Florence Hunter, our most faithful and efficient Treasurer, and appointed a committee (Mrs. Morgan of Parkersburg, Miss Page of Clarksburg, and Mrs. Hartman of Fairmont), to prepare an appropriate resolution. She also stated that Mrs. A. J. Willis, of Kearneysville, had been appointed by the Bishop to take her place.

Mrs. Peterkin then reported that the Woman's Missionary Fund amounted to \$455 this year. The Bishop had appointed

Rev. Geo. P. Bentley, Pratt, W. Va., as the Woman's Missionary, and we shall pay this much on his salary. We regretted that the full amount at which we aim each year (\$500) had not been reached.

Mrs. Morgan then read Mrs. Smith's report of the work of the Church Periodical Club. The number of current periodicals sent regularly during the past year, 86; odd magazines and papers, 365; boxes, etc., contents not counted, 3; traveling libraries, 3.

Mrs. Smith made an earnest appeal for regular contributors to this work.

The Secretary then read a letter from Miss Barber from Anking, China. Mrs. Peterkin gave an informal talk about her work and asked she be remembered more often by the Auxiliary of West Virginia. She stated that the Juniors could send dolls by mail (little china dolls, dressed, but not in white, as that is the Chinese mourning). Miss Barber says the children there are delighted to get American dolls for Christmas.

Miss Emery's annual letter was read, and the letter as to our uniting with the other branches in the third province. However, since our Council has determined that the diocese shall not belong to the province, we shall not belong either.

The Auxiliary then adjourned for luncheon with members of the Council.

At 2:30 we were called together again and opened the meeting by singing "Christ for the World We Sing," after which Bishop Gravatt had prayers and then gave the Auxiliary a talk upon the work. He stated that the \$500 pledge for Williams-town had been paid, \$501 in fact; and he asked that this year the Auxiliary pledge \$500 towards building a rectory at Princeton. This was promised him immediately. Then he asked that the Juniors pledge again \$100 for a missionary to work in the diocese during the summer as they did last year.

Miss Brady then gave her report as Secretary of the Auxiliary, the most encouraging that we have ever had. For the first time all reports were in and twenty-nine branches had reported in time for the annual meeting. All pledges had been met during the past year, and the total value of the work of the Auxiliary as given in their reports was \$4,782.97. There were not so many

boxes as last year, but that was because there were so many special pledges. To Brazil, \$167.75; to St. Mary's, Shanghai, \$544.25, including the \$105 which the Juniors sent; to Miss Thackera for nurse, \$24.00; for organ fund for Liberian mission, \$19.00. But, best of all, the amount for General Missions which we aim to give each year was more than paid, \$544.50. Some few of the Branches have neglected to send in anything for the Central Fund, and we have not quite enough on hand for the printing of the Year Book.

There were other special pledges showing that the Auxiliary is taking a wider interest in the work of missions.

The report of the Secertary of the Juniors was then read by Miss Brady in Mrs. Gravatt's absence. She reported eleven branches, ten boxes valued at \$198.71 and money to the amount of \$697.38, making a total of \$897.71.

Mrs. Douglas had sent her report of the Little Helpers' or Babies' Branch. Seven branches had sent in \$74.04 for missions.

Miss Pryor, the Custodian of the United Offering, had sent word that she had received since last October, when she took charge, \$83.84.

The special committee reported as follows:

It is with the most sincere regret that the West Virginia branch of the Woman's Auxiliary receives the resignation of Miss Florence Hunter, our most capable Treasurer; therefore,

Resolved, That we, the members of the West Virginia branch, tender Miss Hunter our heartfelt thanks for her most careful and painstaking work during the years of her treasurership, and assure her of our deep appreciation of the same and of her continued interest in our welfare.

Mrs. Peterkin then spoke of the action taken at New York urging the Auxiliary to organize the young women of the parishes into what is called "Section B. of the Woman's Auxiliary." There are always so many years between the time when the young women are too old to be called Juniors and before they are willing to join the Woman's Auxiliary which is usually made up of the older women of the parish. The "Section B" can be

a perfectly independent Auxiliary so far as the other branch of the parish is concerned.

Mrs. Aschman spoke of the Constitution and By-Laws which the West Virginia branch of the Auxiliary had adopted in 1904 and they were ordered printed in the Year Book of 1914.

Mrs. Brittingham offered an appropriate resolution of thanks to the pastor and people of the Methodist Church for the use of the room.

Mrs. Peterkin then requested that we take an offering for General Missions. She spoke of the deficit which faces the Board at the close of the year unless the church arouses herself, and said that any amount we might send would express our desire to help. The offering amounted to \$10.02, which the Secretary was directed to send to Miss Emery at once.

The meeting then closed with the singing of "From Greenland's Icy Mountains."

Before we left the room we were greatly delighted when the women present from the Morgantown Church asked us to stop a moment while they told us through Mrs. Edmundson that they had felt badly to think that they had no part in the fine work which they had realized from that day's conference that the Auxiliary is doing, and that they had then and there resolved to organize a branch for the Morgantown parish, with Mrs. J. M. Crane as President, and that they hoped to present a report next year.

Address of the President

The past year with our West Virginia Auxiliary Branch, has been one of real substantial growth, not only in giving, but in an intelligent interest in the whole missionary field. Our pledge for the Williamstown Church in our own diocese, was gladly and promptly responded to; the Woman's Missionary Fund, a voluntary offering for a missionary in West Virginia; the pledge made by your President at the Woman's Auxiliary meeting in New York last October for at least \$300 towards the new buildings for St. Mary's Church School for girls at Shanghai, China, has been overpaid, much to my delight; our insurance of one of the missionaries in Brazil; our help for an organ in a mission in Liberia, Africa; aid to Miss Thackera for a nurse to assist her in her arduous and God-like work in the hospital of The Good Samaritan at Fort Defiance, Arizona, for Indians; articles sent to the Yearly Fair at Fairbanks, Alaska—all this besides boxes sent both in and out of West Virginia, and clothing, night clothing and bed linen to one of our very worthy and noble hospitals, "Sheltering Arms," at Hansford, W. Va., where no less than 1,760 patients were cared for during the past year—most of whom but for that hospital would have received neither tender care, nor nursing, nor even medical attention. I do not mention all these avenues of our work in vain-glory or self-satisfaction, but that we may see in a concrete form how wide and varied are the different ways in which we work; and for our encouragement that we are learning,

not only the kindness of giving, "hoping for nothing again," but our vision is enlarging, our hearing the cry is keener and our hearts are responding more quickly.

During the past year I have visited the Branches at Charles Town and Middleway, Nelson Parish, New Martinsville and Sistersville, and visited Ripley, where I organized an Auxiliary of nine members. My earnest hope is to get a Branch of this mighty force for woman's work in every parish and every mission station in our diocese—it will not only be a help to the parish, but to each woman who thereby acknowledges her duty and privilege in trying to spread the gospel among men.

It is coming, for each year, I find more women who are asking, "What can I do?" and that shows an awakened conscience, and if each member of our Auxiliary, and there are more than six hundred now on the roll, would try to get just one more woman to join us, how it would help us all—Can't it be done?

We still lack system and, what for want of a better name I must call cohesion, but that will come with time, and right here let me thank you for your ever ready acquiescence in any call I present to your notice—it heartens me very much to know I have such an earnest band behind me.

Since we met last June, the General Convention has come and gone, and with it the United Thank Offering which amounted, as you know, to \$307,000, brought from all over the world and presented to God at that great service at the Cathedral St. John the Divine—while our part was good, \$3,100., and it was a notable offering, it does not strike me as a very generous thank offering from about 600,000 persons in three years—a little over 16 cents per woman! May we strive to make it more of a real expression of our gratitude to our Heavenly Father for all His numberless and never-failing mercies to us day by day—for "His mercies are new every morning."

In conclusion let me beg that we always remember that our prayers are of much more value than our gifts, let us always pray at our meetings, as well as in our closets for God's blessings on our work, and for all who are laboring either at home or abroad for the extension of His Kingdom, and above all for His

Holy Spirit that it may rule our hearts and lives, so that all
may "take knowledge of us that we have been with Jesus."

Seven Branches are delinquent. The Secretary distributed nearly two hundred boxes and wrote many letters and cards. Of the new branches, only two reported—namely, Charles Town and Morgantown. This failure of the others was a keen disappointment, for I know of two instances where the pennies were ready for collection, and one mother sent me the money from her little girl's barrel, and in her letter commended the work and deplored the lack of interest on the part of the one who had failed to perform her pledged duty. The suggestion, made at the General Convention, that the Auxiliary in all its branches, should work as a unit, is admirable, the idea being that the Babies' Branch, with its members composed of the little ones from infancy to seven years of age, the two sections of the Juniors and the two of the Seniors shall work in harmony, with a common end in view. I therefore ask that the President of the Woman's Auxiliary in each parish will co-operate with me in starting this work and securing conscientious and consecrated leaders. The germ of growth of education in Missionary Work is in the Little Helpers. If I may venture to throw out a hint of a method which has been found helpful, I will say that the Rector of the Church in Huntington announced from the Chancel that there would be a special service for the Little Helpers on the following Thursday, when the contents of the barrels would be

collected. The Infant Class room was made attractive with flowers and plants; chairs were conveniently arranged, and a table placed in the center upon which the offerings were to be presented. The Rector in his vestments gave a short address and repeated the special collects; the little ones sang several hymns which they had learned in the Sunday School, after which each one came forward and placed his or her offering on the table. When the service was concluded refreshments were served, thus giving the Director opportunity to mingle with those under her charge. Many of the mothers were present and were charmed and delighted. It resulted in special requests for new boxes.
