Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, 1920

The two days' session of the Auxiliary was opened by a corporate Communion in Trinity Church, Huntington, at 7:30 Thursday morning, May 27th, which was well attended.

The formal opening of the twenty-seventh annual meeting was at 9:30 a. m., in the parish house of Trinity Church, Mrs. Peterkin, the president, in the chair. After singing the hymn, "Fling Out the Banner," and the reading of the "Litany of Missions," by the Rev. Mr. Strider, Miss Brady, the secretary, called the roll, and delegates responded as follows: Bluefield, 2; Bramwell, 1; Charleston, 6; Charles Town, 2; Eckman, 1; Huntington, Sec. A, 12; Huntington, Sec. B, 2; Leetown, 1; Martinsburg, 1; Moorefield, 1; Parkersburg, Good Shepherd, Sec. A, 6; Parkersburg, Good Shepherd, Sec. B, 2; Parkersburg, Trinity, Sec. A, 3; Parkersburg, Trinity, Sec. B, 1; Point Pleasant, 2; Summit Point, 1; St. Albans, 2; Welch and Gary, 1; Weston, 2; Wheeling, St. Luke's, 1; Wheeling, Sec. A, 4; Sec. B, 1. The Junior department answered to the roll call as follows: Bramwell, 1; Charleston, 1; Charles Town, Zion, 2; Huntington, 2; Martinsburg, 1; Middleway, 1; Morgantown, 1; Moundsville, 1; Parkersburg, Good Shepherd, 2; Trinity, 1.

A number of others attended and the parish house was found too small for the meeting and the rest were all held in the Methodist Church which was kindly loaned to Trinity Church for our use.

After the roll call the secretary read the minutes of the preceding meeting and called attention to the Year Book for 1919, which was there for distribution. The President then delivered her address.

The treasurer's report for 1919 was discussed, and then read for the five months just passed, in order that we might have some idea as to the condition of affairs today. It proved satisfactory, but Miss Brady again reminded the branches of the one hundred dollars promised Bishop Capers of West Texas by the delegates in Detroit, and which has been neglected by many of the branches. She begged that each

branch which had not already done so, send \$5.00 for this purpose at once to the treasurer, Mrs. Willis.

The secretary then gave her report in which she had hoped she might state she had visited all the branches of the Auxiliary in the Diocese during the year. She had visited all but five. She had also attended the Triennial in Detroit in October. The secretary stated that reports had been received for this Year Book from 38 branches, last year from only 31.

In tabulating reports she has found that in 1917 the treasurer had reported as passing through her hands, \$2,438.28; in 1918, \$2,728.21, and in 1919, \$3,391.70, which shows an encouraging gain. For this year there were 19 boxes sent inside the Diocese valued at \$855.83, mostly to the Sheltering Arms Hospital. There were also several boxes of fruit unvalued. Eight boxes sent outside the Diocese valued at \$360.07. Total box value, \$1,215.90.

This is a very good total, and yet the secretary felt obliged to call attention to the fact that only 29 branches had sent any money to General Missions and no branch should omit to do that.

THE DAY OF PRAYER was observed by 31 branches and the offering on that day was \$1,313.30. Of this amount \$1,200 was paid for the salary of a physician for the Good Shepherd Hospital for Navajo Indians at Fort Defiance, Arizona. The balance was paid to the One Day's Income Fund.

THE CENTRAL FUND amounted to \$72.00 from 28 branches. This will not be enough to pay for the Year Book this year. Last year for 700 books we paid for printing and

postage, \$64.45, and this year it will cost for only 500, about \$145.00, including postage. It was decided that each branch must add \$2.00 to that already sent and those branches which have sent nothing shall send \$3.00.

This is important! So let each branch send at once to Mrs. Willis. We owe now for the Year Books and have not the money to pay for them. They will be distributed soon. If there should be mistakes please inform the secretary and correction will be made in the Church News.

The fund for Miss Thackara's assistant is DISCONTINUED, as we now support the doctor for this hospital in Arizona.

The secretary asked again about the TRAVELING LIBRARIES. If they will be returned to Wheeling, St. Matthew's Church, they will be refurnished and sent out again. If Miss Brady is informed of their whereabouts, she will send money for their transportation.

The secretary reported that there has been a greatly increased interest in Mission Study. More than half the branches reported some kind of Missionary Study during the past year.

Mrs. Williams, the secretary for the Church Periodical Club for the Diocese, was introduced to the Auxiliary and spoke of the work, urging that the magazines needed so badly in the mission field and church institutions should be forwarded and not wasted. She wants a parish secretary in every church and mission in the Diocese.

The meeting then adjourned for church service with the council at 11 o'clock.

SECOND SESSION

At 2 p. m. the Auxiliary met in the Methodist Church for conference and there was a large attendance. The Conference was opened by a short devotional service held by the Chairman, Mrs. A. B. Mitchell; secretary of the Eastern Convocation, Mrs. Wm. Meade, acted as secretary for the afternoon. Mrs. Mitchell spoke very earnestly, stressing the point that the purpose of the Conference was to stimulate and encourage Auxiliary work.

Mrs. Adams, the president of the Woman's Auxiliary for the Province of Washington, and member of the National Executive Committee, had come to us from Pittsburgh and was introduced to the Auxiliary by Mrs. Mitchell. Mrs. Adams

gave a talk on the reorganization of the Auxiliary as effected in Detroit. She answered questions and the women were much interested in discussing the new methods. It does not mean any great difference in our Diocese, as we are only urged to speed up our work. We are including new work for Social Service and Religious Education. The work for the Sheltering Arms Hospital comes under the branch of Social Service, and we hope for an increased interest in Religious Education, which is very important. Mrs. Adams discussed the new plan for box work. We cannot adopt it entirely, but may make some change toward it. Mrs. Adams' talk was most helpful and interesting.

A short discussion followed as to whether we can re-organize and there was afterwards a most interesting discussion on "How Can We Increase Our Membership?"

Mrs. Andrews of Martinsburg, told of their branch having doubled its membership in the past year, the importance of every Church enlisting the young people in Sec. B was stressed by Miss Brady.

Mrs. Green, of Huntington, leader of Sec. B, said that Mission Study classes were of the greatest help. About 12 branches represented said they had had study classes during the year. Mrs. Green said her Sec. B was divided into six groups of five each, and each member of the group was pledged to give or earn \$10.00 towards the year's work.

Upon motion the Conference adjourned 'til Friday morning. Friday morning the Rev. A. B. Mitchell read the Litany of Missions. Mrs. Mitchell again took the chair. Mrs. Ewers, the secretary for the linen for the Sheltering Arms Hospital made her report and the whole subject was thoroughly discussed. Mrs. Ewers is willing to buy, ready made, any quantity of linen if any branches prefer to send her the money. Branches are urged to make bed gowns, and have linen showers and send all they can, but Mrs. Ewers asks especially that all boxes sent direct to the hospital shall be valued and reported to her.

Friday afternoon Mrs. Peterkin was in the chair and introduced Rev. Ben Roller, who spoke of missionary work in West Virginia. Mrs. Peterkin spoke of being anxious for the Auxiliary to secure a Ford for one of our missionaries who walks six miles each Sunday. Bishop Gravatt then appeared and spoke of the help the Auxiliary's \$800.00 for the Archdeacon's Salary had been, and asked that it be renewed. He explained that while he has no additional Archdeacon as he hoped to have, he had used the thousand dollars the

women and Juniors have given him to send clergy and laymen to have missionary services in many places. The Auxiliary voted immediately to give the Bishop what he asked.

Mrs. Mitchell then continued the Conference, and the question of the advisability of changing the time of the Auxiliary meeting to a separate time and place from the council was discussed. It was unanimously decided not to change. The only argument in favor was that the two bodies meeting at the same time might be a burden on the smaller places, but representatives from the smaller places were very decided in their opinion that they could be hospitable enough to manage the entertainment once in fourteen years.

Mrs. Vinson urged the attendance upon the Summer Conference Schools for training church workers.

The question of dues or pledges was discussed.

Deaconess Cox from St. Matthew's, Wheeling, then conducted a Model Study Class which was very interesting.

At four o'clock the young people of Trinity parish under Mrs. Renshaw's direction gave two plays, "America's Expenditures," and "Tired of Missions." They were excellent and given with great spirit, and certainly were illuminating. We wish every member of the Church in West Virginia could have seen them. One clergyman said he thought they should be given at the Sunday night service.

Mrs. W. C. Renshaw, Huntington, will tell anyone where they can be procured.

After the plays the Juniors served tea to the Auxiliary and visitors at the parish house. This ended the Auxiliary meeting. It was the first two days' Conference we have had and every one expressed the opinion that it was a most helpful and inspiring meeting. We are already making plans for the two days next year.
