

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Presiding Bishop and Council

The Thirtieth Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese met in Christ Church, Clarksburg, June 14th and 15th, with the following number of delegates answering the call: Charleston, St. Johns, 1; Charles Town, Zion, 1; Clarksburg, Christ Church, 6; Fairmont, Christ Church, 6; Grafton, St. Matthias, 5; Huntington, Trinity, Sec. B 1; Martinsburg, Trinity, 1; Middleway, Nelson Parish 1; Parkersburg, Good Shepherd 5, Sec. B 1; Parkersburg, Trinity 3, Sec. B 2; Point Pleasant, Christ Church, 2; St. Albans, St. Marks, 1; Wheeling, St. Lukes 1, St. Matthews 1, Sec. B 1; Weston, St. Pauls 6, Sec. B 2.

The Holy Communion was celebrated at 9:30 A. M. Wednesday by the Bishop, assisted by the Rector of the Church. At 10:30 the meeting was called to order in the Parish House by the President of the Auxiliary, Mrs. Peterkin. After a welcome to Christ Church by Mrs. Dorsey Potter, the roll call and the reading of the minutes of the last meeting, the President read her annual address, which was full of encouragement. She announced the formation of one new branch at Princeton, making forty-two in all.

The report of the Secretary and of the Treasurer followed. The Secretary stated that the Year Book for 1921 was in the hands of the Auxiliary. The Treasurer's report for the five months just passed was read.

The Secretary called attention to the fact that only \$61.50 had been paid to the Central Fund and that the bill for the Year Book and postage (\$138.50) was due. This matter was taken up later in the day and upon motion it was resolved that the **Central Fund be doubled**. This will pay for the Year Book and letterhead paper for the officers.

At noon Mrs. Peterkin read prayers for Missions.

The report of the Church Periodical Club was read and Miss Brady stated that she had heard Missionaries from the foreign field say that they would be very glad to get the picture supplements to the "New York Times" and other Sunday papers. Mrs. Abney Payne, 1585 Virginia Street, Charleston, the West Virginia correspondent for the Church Periodical Club, will give to anyone who asks her the address of a Mis-

sionary who would be very glad to receive any periodical sent regularly.

The report of the Woman's Missionary Fund was then given and Mrs. Peterkin stated that last year it amounted to \$463.70 and this year to date \$264.00. She hoped this year, since half the amount has been paid, the full amount of \$500 will be given towards the support of our Missionary in the Diocese.

At one o'clock a delicious luncheon was served by the ladies of Christ Church in the Parish House.

At two o'clock the Auxiliary again assembled and Miss Peterkin gave the report of the United Thank Offering to date.

The Bishop of the Diocese then gave a most interesting talk. He recalled the help the Auxiliary had given to the Diocese in years gone by, instancing the Portable Chapels, the pledge each year to the Sheltering Arms Hospital for linen, and the "Archdeacons' Fund." He gave an account of the way in which the last named fund had been spent to further the work of the Diocese. It will be remembered that until the Bishop secures an Archdeacon, the fund has been placed at his discretion, to supply lay workers, etc. He spoke of the service done by the automobile which the Auxiliary gave to the Diocese a year ago, and stated that he hoped to have the second automobile some time in August.

The Bishop spoke further of the general work of the Auxiliary and expressed the hope that the Auxiliary would take care to keep its status in the Church unchanged and always specialize in missions as during the past fifty years.

Mrs. Peterkin reported that Mrs. Green had sent in her resignation as Secretary of Section B. This was heard with regret and the Auxiliary discussed as never before the problem of enlisting the young women of the Church in missionary work. Everyone realized that in every parish there were many young women unorganized but who might become interested under proper leadership. It was resolved to ask Mrs. Green to withdraw her resignation upon the promise of the Auxiliary to give her some definite work to present to those whom she is to try to organize. This matter was to be brought up again the next day.

At 3:30 Mrs. Shdewsbury gave her report of the Junior work for the past year, which was most encouraging. The report showed thirty branches organized with six hundred members. Mrs. Shrewsbury called the roll and there were twenty-six Juniors and Leaders present.

The report of the Little Helpers was then read and Mrs.

Peterkin made an earnest plea in Mrs. Moss' name for more branches.

At eight o'clock "The Blue Cashmere Gown" (a missionary play which may be obtained from the Headquarters of the Auxiliary) was given by the Juniors of Christ Church. They presented it very well indeed. Afterwards Mrs. Shrewsbury gave a charming talk on methods of interesting children. She told how Trinity Church, Huntington, had raised \$1,100 for the Sunday School Lenten Offering. The Sunday School worked out a plan which they had heard of and it proved most successful. One could see that back of it all was the intense interest of the teachers which was communicated to the scholars.

On Thursday morning at 9:30 the Auxiliary assembled in the Church and the Bishop read the "Litany of Missions" and then gave a solemn talk on "The Spiritual Side of the Woman's Auxiliary." We wish every member could have heard the emphasis which he laid upon the life of prayer for which the Auxiliary stands, and which he said should always be our first concern.

At 10:30 the business session was resumed in the Parish House with a good attendance. The Secretary read the summary of the work for the year 1921.

Mrs. Peterkin announced that the next meeting of the Auxiliary would be at the same time next year and would be held in St. John's Church, Charleston, upon the invitation of that branch extended through Mrs. Laidley.

The action of the Treasurer in placing the surplus over the amount received for the "Archdeacon's Salary" to the Bishop's Special Fund was ratified.

A resolution of thanks to the Christ Church Branch and to the people of Clarksburg for their hospitality was passed.

At eleven Mrs. Peterkin gave up the chair to Mrs. Shrewsbury for the Junior Auxiliary meeting. The two hours devoted to the Juniors, their work and the methods of leading them, was most interesting. Mrs. Shrewsbury read a letter from Miss Etta Ambler and the Juniors decided to pledge \$200 to complete the wall about the new Koryama Kindergarten. At the request of a small boy present Mrs. Ambler recited the Lord's Prayer in the Japanese language.

At one o'clock luncheon was again served and Bishop Gravatt very happily voiced the thanks of the Auxiliary for the hospitality received.

At two o'clock Miss Dorsey gave an interesting talk on the work at "St. Andrews on the Mountain," in Jefferson county. This is the first time Miss Dorsey has met the Auxiliary and it was a great pleasure to have her with us, for we have

admired her for years on account of her faithful work of self sacrifice. When the Auxiliary found that she needed a Victrola we gave her the offering taken at the Wednesday morning service and then took another offering at once, which in all amounted to \$58.32. It was then resolved to ask each branch, not represented at Clarksburg to send \$1.00 at once to Mrs. Willis to complete the amount of money needed. Records will also be most welcome. Miss Dorsey has a day school of over ninety pupils at the Mountain Mission and also a night school. She has two faithful assistants and with their help she holds Mothers' meetings, visits and cares for the sick, etc.

At three o'clock the Bishop again addressed the meeting on the subject, "How Can the Auxiliary Best Promote the Work of the Church in West Virginia?" One thing he asked of the Auxiliary was that we pay the salary of the Superintendent of the Sheltering Arms Hospital (\$1,500). When the Auxiliary considered the fact that last year they had paid over \$1,500 to specials outside the Diocese (the Emery Fund, etc., as listed elsewhere) which we are not asked for this year, they assented at once to the Bishop's request. The Secretary will apportion the amount. The Bishop also spoke of the Missionary at work at "Christ Church on the Mountain," in Jefferson county,—"a Christian lady" doing a fine work, isolated and most inadequately sheltered all last winter in a rude log hut. A decent house is necessary and this the Bishop proposes to erect as a Community House. It will be simple and constructed of logs but will have a suitable room for Mrs. Campbell, the Missionary.

The following resolution was offered by Miss Peterkin and adopted: "Since Mrs. Green is to be asked to take charge again of the work of Section B,

"Be it Resolved, That the Woman's Auxiliary promises to further her work by assisting in forming circles of the young women not now organized as either Juniors or the Woman's Auxiliary;

"And furthermore, We suggest that Section B, with the help of these new circles, promise to Bishop Gravatt \$500 toward the building of the proposed Community House at Christ Church on the Mountain, in Jefferson county."

The members of Section B who were present expressed themselves as willing to undertake this pledge with the help of the branches to be organized and felt quite sure the amount could be raised.

After the singing of "From Greenland's Icy Mountains" and prayers, the Bishop pronounced the Benediction and the meeting stood adjourned.

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS TO THE AUXILIARY

It is hardly necessary for me to say how glad I am to meet our West Virginia Auxiliary again, nor to tell you how much I rejoice over our growth and increased usefulness, but still, as it is good hearing, I will do so. This is our first meeting by ourselves without the presence of the Council, and I certainly trust it will be productive of much good and show, as it has done in old Virginia, that we are not now a clinging vine, but a sturdy tree, laden with good fruit, with branches reaching into almost every town and mission of our Church in West Virginia. When I look back on our thirty-two years of existence and recall our birth and first feeble years, it seems almost incredible that we have so grown and increased, and we must remember that God is with us, and to Him alone is the glory.

We now number forty-two branches, some large, some small, but all willing to do their part whenever called on. We have only to notice the result of the Offering on the Day of Prayer, the gift towards the Emery Fund, the Woman's Missionary, and the Automobile Fund, besides our pledges to see the latent strength of the Auxiliary. This is not praise, but a just appreciation of the hearty co-operation which I always get and which I warmly appreciate. There was sent out from Auxiliary Headquarters in New York a questionnaire as to how we felt towards women being admitted into Vestries, and to represent the Church in Council and General Convention, and from the answers received I do not think it was acceptable to most of our women. Now that we have the vote, the question looms up and will continue to do so. It is my opinion that the question will be settled in the affirmative in the course of time. It behooves us, therefore, to consider how to deal with this privilege when it is ours.

These are days of unrest and change, and it has struck our dear Church and many radical changes are proposed in the Prayer Book. Some wish to renounce Protestantism and all that it stands for, and others think change and shortened services are needed and are rushing on changes that will change the whole Prayer Book and make the services whatever each minister chooses to make it, instead of the restful dignity and great thought that the whole Church is worshipping God with the same words of prayer and praise throughout the whole world. It is a sad thought that while other Christian churches are using more and more of a form of service, we who have this precious privilege are giving up much of it. Some changes must come with the years but they should be approached cautiously. These are only my personal views but I felt I must say a few words on a subject on which I feel so deeply.

I wish before closing to urge all the branches to have a Mission Study class if possible. We **must learn**, if we are to give out information, and they have been so helpful wherever tried. If a Mission Study class sounds too formidable, have a Mission Reading circle, but by all means, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest, not only the Bible, but the missionary work of the Church throughout the world.

I trust we all feel it is good for us to be here and go back to our homes strengthened and helped by mutual aid and counsel.

Let us never forget our motto: "With Good Will Doing Service."
