President's Report To The Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary

The detailed accomplishments of the Auxiliary for the year 1933, reported by the Secretaries here, and in the Year Book, speak for themselves. From them, I am sure you will agree with me that the Auxiliary is going forward along the paths laid out for us by our former, very efficient, officers.

Several new branches have been formed, thus we have grown in numbers which means a desire on the part of our women to share in the Missionary work of the Church and that means Spiritual Growth.

They are always glad to send them, and you will thrill to know you have some part in the splendid work they are doing. How much easier it will be to raise your apportionments too.

Be sure to write "281" for a report on the mission or missionary to whom you are sending your Supply Work, it will make it all so personal and worth while.

So that some of your diocesan officers may be able to meet with you please send to the Pres. and the Sec. the dates of your Con. meetings. Also the names of your Con. officers and any changes in the parish officers. It is impossible to keep up the mailing lists unless we are notified of such changes. This year we had more trouble with the mails than ever before and many notices had to be resent.

It took three months for some of the reports to be returned to the Sec. and then the Year Book had gone to press.

I hope the inspiration given us by our speakers, the sincerity of our purpose and this exchange of ideas will enable us to go forward with renewed vigor, determined that nothing can stop the growth and usefulness of this great Woman's Auxiliary.

Report of the Forty-Second Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary

Of the Protestant Episcopal Church, Diocese of West Virginia.

The Forty-second Annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Protestant Episcopal Church, Diocese of West Virginia, was held at Zion Church, Charles Town, West Virginia, May 22nd and 23rd, 1934.

The opening service, Tuesday evening, was in charge of the Rev. John W. Gummere, Rector. The Rt. Rev. William L. Gravatt conducted a confirmation service.

The Rev. J. Armistead Welborn, former missionary to Japan, in the address of the evening, discussed the work of the Church in Japan. He stated that "In 1859 Bishop Williams of Virginia went as the first missionary Bishop to Japan. Before the end of the nineteenth century the Church was well established as the "Holy Catholic Church of Japan." However, the Japanese Church cannot be self supporting as yet. The clergy are from the Samurai class, the best educated in the country, but not the wealthy class of merchants. The Woman's Auxiliary is now established in Japan. There is a great need for doctors, nurses, hospitals, and schools." He closed his address by reading the poem "In Christ there is no East nor West."

An informal reception followed in the Parish House where the guests were received by Miss Christine Washington, Mrs. T. C. Bowling, and the ladies of the parish. Refreshments were served by members of the Junior Woman's Auxiliary.

Wednesday, May 23rd.

The delegates assembled at 10 o'clock when Holy Communion was administered by the Rt. Rev. William L. Gravatt, assisted by Rev. John W. Gummere.

The delegates convened in the Parish House for the business session. The meeting was opened with the Woman's Auxiliary Prayer led by our President, Mrs. Roger L. Kingsland.

The Rev. J. W. Gummere, speaking for Mrs. Alexander, who was ill, welcomed the Woman's Auxiliary in behalf of St. Andrew's Parish, a parish in which the Woman's Auxiliary has functioned for fifty-one years.

The minutes of the last meeting, which was held at Charleston were read and approved. A letter of greeting was received from Mrs. George Peterkin, our Honorary President, who wrote, "why not have a "Big Sister" movement and let each well organized branch adopt, or put on its feet, a small band of earnest women. I think it would help the "Big Sisters" as much, if not more, than it would the "Little Sisters".

Mrs. Kingsland appointed a committee consisting of Mrs. Snydor and Mrs. Hopkins, to send a wire of greeting to Mrs. Peterkin.

Twenty-four Auxiliaries responded to the roll-call with 77 delegates present.

The delegates were addressed by the Rt. Rev. William L. Gravatt who expressed his appreciation for the passing of the resolution of last year in which he was given the privilege of using the money apportioned to New Work as he saw fit, thereby strengthening the work of the Church.

It was announced that the Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary would be held in Atlantic City, N. J., October 10th to 20th.

The report of the Treasurer, Mrs. A. J. Willis, was read and approved. A letter of regret from Mrs. Peterkin, relative to the resignation of Mrs. A. J. Willis as Treasurer was read, upon which Mrs. Willis received a vote of thanks for her years of faithful service, and a hope for her continued work as Treasurer. Thereupon a motion was made and approved not to accept her resignation of last year.

A letter from Mrs. M. C. Hammond, Custodian of the United Thank Offering, stated, "Let every woman in the Church redouble her efforts this summer and send me, not later than September 15th, an offering to be added to what we already have, that will be a credit to the loving, thankful hearts of the woman of the Diocese of West Virginia."

A letter was read from Miss Lindley of New York, in which she expressed her wish that every effort would be made to bring the purpose of the United Thank Offering to every woman in the diocese.

Miss Zeta Lively, Educational Secretary, discussed the study program of the ensuing year. Barry's "Study of the Prayer Book" will be used as well as the courses on Japan.

Mrs. R. A. Lampton, Chairman of the Junior Woman's Auxiliary, told of the work accomplished by her groups. She reported seven branches with 195 members.

Mrs. H. N. Browne, Supply Secretary, expressed her gratitude to the branches for their cooperation in sending their full assignments. She quoted Mrs. Wade, National Supply Secretray, relative to the splendid work of the Auxiliary in W. Va.

Mrs. Abney Payne, Correspondent Church Periodical Club, reported the far reaching work of the club in sending magazines to those who do

not have access to them.

Noon-day prayers were led by the Rev. C. W. Brickman.

Mrs. Jacob Brittingham, Chairman of the Advance Work Program which closed in 1933, reported that of the \$1200.00 promised \$775.00 was given.

Mrs. N. W. Reese, representative of the Good Friday Offering (Near East), reported that only one-fifth of the parishes share in the cause. Eighteen thousand dollars has been given by the American Church through the Good Friday offerings to keep alive the work in the motherland of Christianity.

The Rev. C. W. Brickman reported a personal study of the missions of West Virginia. The material now being compiled will soon be ready for distribution.

Miss Walker, of Bluefield, told of the splendid work being done by her Junior Auxiliary. They are establishing a lending library.

Mrs. Kingsland, in her President's Report to the Auxiliary, spoke of the work of the Auxiliary in the past and in the future. She gave us valuable advice as to the many ways of "helping the work go forward with renewed vigor and determination, so that nothing can stop the growth and usefulness of the Woman's Auxiliary."

A Resolutions Committee composed of Mrs. Abbott and Mrs. Lee, read a resolution concerning the death of Mrs. George Campbell who had served as a Missionary in West Virginia. The Secretary was instructed to send copies of the resolution to Mrs. Campbell's family.

The delegates were served luncheon in the Parish House dining room by the Peterkin branch.

Wednesday 2:00 P. M.

The Group re-convened at two o'clock in the afternoon.

Bishop Strider in his address, "Responsibilities of our Modern Citizenship" spoke of the present social crisis; the error in our philosophy of life; and the need of a re-valuation of the values of life.

Report Of Convocations

Eastern Convocation

The sixteenth annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Eastern Convocation was held in Grace Church, Middleway, Tuesday,

September 18, 1934, opening at 10:30 A. M. with Holy Communion. Bishop R. E. L. Strider being the celebrant, assisted by the Rev. Hunter Davidson.

Mrs. Macoughtry, president of the local branch, gave a cordial welcome to all Auxiliaries, Ministers and visitors present.

Miss Nellie V. Grove, president, opened the meeting with prayer, and a hymn was sung by the whole assembly. The roll call showed ten of the eleven branches represented by fifty-five members and five ministers.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and corrected as follows: first, Mrs. Kingsland had asked that the treasurer of the Diocese be allowed to lay aside \$1.00 from each branch per year to help defray the expenses of the Diocesan President to General Convention. Second, owing to illness and other causes, Shepherdstown was unable to entertain the Diocesan Auxiliary as planned so Charles Town gave a cordial invitation and royal welcome to all Auxiliaries of the Diocese in May 1934.

Mrs. Wynkoop and Mrs. Bowling were chosen to represent the Eastern Convocation Auxiliaries at General Convention in Atlantic City.

At the request of Mrs. A. J. Willis, two verses of Hymn No. 295 were sung in memorial to our beloved Missionary, Mrs. Georgia Campbell, for a number of years a most faithful worker at Christ's Church on the Mountain. Our treasurer distributed several copies of the 1933 year book and Blue Box leaflets and spoke very encouragingly of the work to date as the year book expenses, programs and Diocesan President's expenses to General Convention were all paid in full.

Miss Grove and Mrs. Mitchell spoke of their former visits to general conventions.

Miss Cowan gave a splendid account of the work at St. Andrew's and Christ Church, eight miles distant, giving part time to each, and told of lack of necessary chancel equipment at Christ Church. She also requested earnest heartfelt prayers of all our church people for our nearby missions. It was voted to send Miss Cowan \$5.00 from the central fund for slides, etc., for a hymn board at Christ Church.

After a bountiful lunch and social hour at the Rectory, Bishop Strider addressed the Auxiliary in earnest, forceful appeal for more meetings of the kind and for fellowship among all church people. He spoke of modern church not being as effective as the primitive church in fellowship, asking us to get away from smugness and coldness and get together in fellowship, which is as much a part of Christian Religion as prayer and communion. He also asked that each branch form a study class of the Prayer Book and Church History, etc., and to appreciate Miss Lively in her splendid work by getting and studying her books.

He spoke earnestly of West Virginia's share of the 1933 deficit and asked each communicant to send fifty cents or more in envelopes provided

for the purpose by October 1st, to help to defray the general Church deficit.

It was voted to send Bishop Strider the offering, \$8.62, for the same fund.

Miss Grove suggested the branches hold meetings and prayers at the same time the United Thank Offering would be presented at General Convention.

Rev. Leicester Kent of Shepherdstown, gave a splendid account of the wonderful Mission Schools of Western, North Carolina.

Rippon being the next in alphabetical order, Miss LaRue invited the 1935 meeting to St. John's. Mrs. Mitchell suggested special work, such as prayer circles and instructing weaker branches in forming study classes to develop more leaders among the younger members.

Mrs. Coleman Lyne asked Charles Town branches to help Middleway form a Prayer Book Study Class.

Mrs. Wright spoke of a Richmond study class of 350, and having conducted one class herself, offered to write Dr. Sherman, General Instructor, Church Mission House, for a class instructor for early 1935 at a central point.

Mrs. Edmund Taylor spoke of Miss Laura Boyer's method of training members of classes to think for themselves in class work.

The meeting was closed with hymn No. 480 and prayer by the Rector.

Mrs. DeBolt, of Fairmont, expressed the appreciation of the visiting ladies to Rev. Alfriend and the ladies of Weston for our fine meeting. After the benediction led by Rev. Alfriend the meeting adjourned.

The regular annual meeting of the Ohio Valley Division of the

Woman's Auxiliary Convened at St. Paul's Episcopal Church on Tuesday, October 30, at 10:30 o'clock. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion with Reverend George Wood, celebrant.

The business session was called to order by Mrs. Joseph Waterman, Chairman, which was followed by the roll call, which reported 52 members and 8 visitors present. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved, then reports from the different branches were read and discussed.

The Chairman then appointed a nominating committee composed of Mrs. Brouse, of St. Ann's, Miss Peterkin, Good Shepherd and Mrs. Leonard, of Christ's Memorial.

It was moved and seconded that the money from the morning collection be sent to Mrs. R. E. L. Strider, towards a \$100.00 debt at Smoke Hole, which amounted to \$24.42.

Mrs. Brouse, State Supply Secretary, thanked all Auxiliaries for their complete cooperation with her in carrying out her work.

Rev. Hibbard of Moundsville, led the noon-day prayer, after which the meeting was adjourned and all were invited into the Parish House where a delightful luncheon was served.

The afternoon session was called to order at 1:30 o'clock and the minutes of the morning session were read and approved. The nominating committee brought in the following report. Mrs. Dick, of Parkersburg, for Chairman; Mrs. Carrico, for Vice-Chairman, and Mrs. Penn, of Parkersburg, for Secretary. Mrs. Dick immediately declined the nomination so Mrs. Waterman after much persuasion resumed the position as Chairman which was very favorable to all.

Mrs. Leonard extended to the Ohio Valley Division an invitation to come to Williamstown for their next annual meeting.

The Chairman requested the Secretary to send Miss Georgia Beeson, of Williamstown, a get well card.

The Reverend Dr. Waterman then gave an interesting account on the high lights of the General Convention held at Atlantic City. It being the largest single gathering of Episcopalians in the history of our Church. There were 35,000 people present with 1000 in the choir. It was purely an American Organization. They talked of changing the name of the Church to American Episcopal Church, but this move was defeated. There was also a discussion on changing the calendar, having 13 equal months, and of the Motion Picture and its influence on the people of the United States. Dr. Waterman told us in such an interesting manner what Episcopalians really do own, of which was that we maintain 60 Hospitals, having from 8 to 800 beds, with 8,700 beds in all and 4,000 Doctors.

Mrs. Mallory, of Parkersburg, told of the First Session with Holy Communion at eight o'clock on October 11th, with 25,000 there to commune. The communion rail was 172 feet long, which accommodated 100 persons

at one time. Three Bishops presided at this service.

There were 150 girls who took up the collection, 22 girls bringing it forward and it all amounted to \$5000.00. The Bishop appealed for more, and there was \$7,916.00 brought and laid on the steps of the Altar.

Mrs. John Penn told of the United Thank Offering service of which the Auxiliaries are responsible, and Mrs. Chester Waterman told of the Children's offering which was larger than the Woman's and Men's together which was \$922,000.00.

Mrs. Waterman spoke briefly of the National Council and its having four women members, one from South Carolina, California, Ohio and Massachusetts, and wanting younger people in the Auxiliary.

Miss Constance Peterkin thanked Sistersville for a most enjoyable day as Reverend Wood always makes the Division feel so welcome.

Mrs. Vierheller moved the meeting adjourn and Reverend Wood pronounced the benediction.
