The speakers have been as follows: At the annual meeting, Miss Margaret Reed, Secretary of the Union Christian Movement in England, and Mrs. Harper Sibley, member of the National Board of the Woman's Auxiliary. At the spring meeting, Rt. Rev. Thomas F. Davies and Father Souder from the Philippine Islands. At the fall meeting, Miss Eva D. Corey, president of the Massachusetts Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

There have been three regular meetings of the Executive Board. The new member elected this year was Mrs. Charles J. Bellamy. Miss Bausman's resignation was received with regret and Mrs. Stephen Taft appointed to fill the unexpired term.

The Provincial Meeting was held in this diocese in October, at Pittsfield, with Mrs. Everett as presiding officer. The visiting delegates were entertained by our diocese.

The Vice-president of the Berkshire District reports a new branch formed at St. Martin's, Pittsfield; for the Connecticut Valley the Vice-president reports a successful neighborhood meeting in Longmeadow. The Vice-president of the Worcester District has spoken at parish meetings held and one neighborhood meeting.

Report of the Educational Secretary Woman's Auxiliary

The aim of the Educational Department of the Woman's Auxiliary is to have every Parish and Mission in the Diocese plan for some form of educational work in its Parish or Auxiliary program. The Educational Committee consists of Miss Serena Adams of the Berkshire District, Mrs. M. H. Grassly and Mrs. Carl Williams of the Connecticut Valley District, Mrs. Harold Moulton and Mrs. Frederick H. Danker of the Worcester District. Any Parish or Mission which would care to invite one of the committee to visit it and to speak on India or Suggested Books for Reading or Discussion, the invitation would be gladly accepted.

From January, 1930, to June, Discussion Groups, Reading Groups and Program Meetings on the Jerusalem Conference were held in Parishes and Missions in each of the three Districts. In June, the Educational Secretary and Committee attended the Wellesley Conference in preparation for the study of India, which is the subject before the Church for 1931. In November an Institute for Parish leaders was held in each of the three districts — In Pittsfield at St. Stephens, under the leadership of Miss Serena Adams; in Springfield, at Christ Church Cathedral, under the leadership of Mrs. Grassly, with Mrs. Williams, Mrs. Moulton, and Mrs. Danker taking part; in Worcester, at St. Luke's, under the leadership of Mrs. Danker, and Mrs. Williams and Mrs. Moulton. From these Institutes, leaders go back to their Parishes to hold Educational groups during the winter.

Mrs. M. H. Grassly, 76 Pineywoods Avenue, is our Librarian. All requests for books from our Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary Library will be promptly answered.

The Educational Department wishes to thank the Church Periodical Club for its generous gift of thirty-six dollars for books for the Diocesan Library.

Report of Advance Work Ser'y-Treasurer

Last year instead of giving a Corporate Gift, the Auxiliaries decided to spend all their energy on helping the Dioceses raise the money which they had pledged for the Advance Work Program of the Church. Western Massachusetts, as you all know, offered to give the sum of \$19,000.00 towards the new buildings and equipment for the Voorhees School at Denmark, S. C. Whereat we, the Auxiliary, volunteered to help to the extent of a least \$500.00, and as our special part in the work we were assigned the furnishing of as many rooms as possible in the girls' new dormitory at the rate of \$125.00 for each room.

In March I sent out my first letter to each of the Branches in answer to which I received \$387.50 from 21 Branches and in October the second letter went out giving more detailed information regarding the school and receiving in response \$263.00, making a total of \$650.50 from 32 Branches out of the 40 in the Diocese, several of them sending me a second and even a third donation after receiving my second letter, which I greatly appreciated. Added to this sum is \$57.00 from the offering at the autumn meeting in Pittsfield and \$7.00 from the Pittsfield Study Class Institute, which brings our Advance Work for the year to \$714.50, almost enough to furnish six rooms at Voorhees.

This is surely a wonderful record and I want to take this opportunity to thank each one of you for your splendid spirit in responding to the call and I hope you are as happy about it as I am, for as Dr. Wood has said, "By the Advance Work Program we put into the hands of the missionaries the tools with which to exert a powerful, steady influence in the long climb from heathenism to the summit of Christianity and give them that hot spark of enthusiasm by which they are enabled to vitalize the message of the Risen Lord."
