Report of the Educational Secretary Woman's Auxiliary

The aim of the Educational Department of the Woman's Auxiliary is to help the women of the Church become conscious of the issues which the Church faces in these modern times and to take part in building a more Christian world. In connection with the study of *Building a Christian Nation*, which is our study book for 1932, the Findings of the Group Discussions of the Woman's Auxiliary at the Triennial Meeting in Denver, on Family Life and Economic Contacts, Interracial and International Relations and Religious Thinking are worthy of study.

The Educational Committee is made up of members from the three Diocesan districts: Berkshire district, Miss Minnie Adams has taken the place of Miss Serena Adams who was a valued member of the Committee but is now living in Baltimore; Connecticut Valley district, Mrs. Carl Williams, Mrs. M. H. Grassly; Worcester district, Mrs. Harold Moulton, Mrs. Arthur Rice, Mrs. F. H. Danker. Members of this committee will be glad to visit any parish or mission to suggest methods of educational work or to speak on the study book.

From January, 1931, to June, a larger number of Discussion Groups, Reading Groups, and Program Meetings were held on India than in the preceding three years. In June the Educational Committee mentioned above attended the Wellesley Conference in preparation for the study of *Building a Christian Nation*. The experience was one which I wish every Church Woman could have.

On October 6th an Institute for Parish Leaders was held at St. Luke's, Worcester, with an attendance of 30 persons, six parishes represented. The leaders were Mrs. Carl Williams, Mrs. Harold Moulton, Mrs. Arthur Rice, and Mrs. Frederick H. Danker. On October 7th an Institute for Parish Leaders was held at Christ Church, Fitchburg, with an attendance of 37 persons, six parishes represented. The leaders were Mrs. Williams, Mrs. Moulton, and Mrs. Danker. On October 28th an Institute was held in Christ Church Cathedral, Springfield, under the leadership of Mrs. M. H. Grassly, Mrs. Williams, Mrs. Moulton, and Mrs. Danker. Twenty-eight persons were present and nine parishes represented. Five Diocesan officers were present and the offering of \$3.85 was devoted to Advance Work. In Greenfield an Evening Institute was held under the leadership of Mrs. Williams and Mrs. Danker. There was an attendance of 36 persons from the surrounding six parishes and missions.

On December 2nd an Institute was held at St. Stephen's, Pittsfield, under the leadership of Miss Minnie Adams. There was an attendance of 11 persons and the offering amounted to \$2.50.

Space forbids me to tell of the individual work done by members of the Educational Committee, but it includes classes held by Mrs. Moulton, special visits and talks by each member of the Committee when and wherever they were asked.

Mrs. M. H. Grassly, 76 Pinewoods Avenue, Springfield, is our Librarian. Please send all requests for books from our Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary Lending Library to her.

The Educational Department again wishes to thank the Church Periodical Club for its most generous support of its work. This year \$31.00 was received from the Periodical Club.

In spite of these financially troublous times the women of the Auxiliary gave the sum of \$675.00 last year to help the Bishop meet the Advance Work Program pledge made by the Diocese for the Voorhees School at Denmark, South Carolina.

This sum added to the \$700.00 that we gave him in 1930 makes a total of \$1,375.00, which was just the amount needed to furnish eleven of the rooms in the girls' dormitory which, you know, was the part that we were given in the project.

I know that it meant real sacrifice for many of the Branches to make their generous offerings, but I am also sure that they must feel amply repaid when they read of the beautiful buildings that their money has helped to build at Voorhees, enabling a far greater work to be done among those young Negro students.
