Report of Educational Secretary

During the year 1932 the Educational work of the Woman's Auxiliary has continued under the leadership of the Educational Committee, which is composed of Mrs. Harold Moulton, Worcester District; Mrs. Carl Williams, Connecticut Valley District; Miss Minnie Adams, Berkshire District; Mrs. M. H. Grassly, Librarian; and Mrs. Frederick H. Danker, Educational Secretary.

The chief aim of the committee has been to increase the study of "Building a Christian Nation" in 1932 and the Indians and China during 1933. In addition, the study of the "Findings" of the Woman's Auxiliary at the Triennial in Denver is urged during the years between the meetings of the Triennial.

From January, 1932, to June, program meetings, reading groups, and study classes were held in parishes and missions in each of the three Districts. Four members of the Educational Committee attended the Wellesley Conference in June.

In the Worcester District a class was held in connection with the fall Accredited School for Church Teachers and Leaders at All Saints' Church, which met once a week for ten weeks. There was an enrollment of 18 members and two of them took the examination for credit at the end of the course.

In Fitchburg an all-day Institute was held in November to which the neighboring parishes sent delegates. Mrs. Danker, Mrs. Moulton, and Mrs. Williams led this Institute.

In Ware a neighborhood meeting was held in March under the leadership of Mrs. Williams.

The three-day Institute in Springfield, led by the leaders from New York, took the place of the annual Institute held in the fall.

In the Berkshire District Miss Adams visited many parishes and held her annual Institute.

The gift of the Church Periodical Club of \$26.25 for reference books for those who are studying "Facing the Future in Indian Missions" and "Living Issues in China" is most gratefully acknowledged. In the Worcester District the books were used this fall in connection with the course on Indians and China given in the Accredited School for Leaders and were a great help.

Social Service Committee

It is impossible to place any money value on the tremendous amount of social service work done by the women's organizations of our church in this Diocese. If we could know the exact amount of sewing on new garments, the renovation of old ones, and the large quantities of food distributed, it would amount to a surprisingly large sum.

Of the thirty-five Branches reporting, twenty-eight helped the poor of the parish with food, clothing, fuel, or rent; twenty-eight sewed for the Red Cross; nineteen helped the local organizations with work or money; seventeen sent Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets; twelve collected and renovated old clothes; nine provided toys for poor children at Christmas; eight did parish calling; four interested themselves in some particular family and provided for their needs; three provided employment; four reported number of layettes made; two reported having a speaker on social service problems; two reported sending a delegate to the Motion Picture Council; and one provided socials for people no longer able to afford movies or other entertainments.
