The custom of pausing at mid-day to offer a prayer for the Church's Mission has spread widely since it was first proposed by Bishop Hare in 1871. In Wuchang, China, it was started independently in 1880, and in 1891 the practice was adopted by the Brotherhood of Saint Andrew, the Missionary Council taking similar action at Chicago in 1893, and the Church of England Missionary Conference in London in 1894.

At the Church Missions House in New York, at mission stations both at home and abroad, and in hundreds of parish churches, the mid-day prayer for the Church's work is said. Wherever church members are found, in homes, shops, or schools, on land or at sea, the busy occupations of the day are stopped while Christians of all races, in a moment of quiet, lift up their hearts unto the Lord.

Report of the Secretary of Religious Education

The Educational Secretary has been ably assisted during 1935 by Mrs. W. J. Kingston of Springfield, Mrs. Miles Hapgood of Lanesboro, and Mrs. Ralph B. Pease of South Barre.

During the spring we continued to study Orientals at home and abroad, and discovered that they were taking their place in the life of many parts of the world.

Two neighborhood meetings early in the fall at Clinton and at Holyoke were well attended and gave us a fine start on our new subject, "Latin America." All-day Institutes were held at Lenox and at the Cathedral. Your Secretary has given a course of six talks on Latin America in the six Churches of Worcester, all well attended by large groups from each Church and some visitors. The series started with a Latin American Luncheon, which warmed everybody up for the winter's activities. She is giving a series of five talks at St. Paul's, Holyoke, and in different Churches in Webster, and spoke at 33 meetings altogether in 1935.

The C. P. C. has been very generous, contributing \$27.20 during 1935, and we thank them most sincerely. Mrs. Moulton and Mrs. Pease were delegates to the Wellesley Conference.

The attendance at Educational Meetings is increasing; more classes are being held; and many more books purchased; and we hope that these signs mean increased interest in the Church's work.
