President's Address.

Members and Friends of the Auxiliary:

Another year has passed since many of us have met and it is with pleasure I welcome you my fellow workers to this our annual meeting.

To our aged and beloved Bishop we extend our sincere and heartiest welcome, and we earnestly hope he will be spared to attend many more annual meetings with us.

I also desire to extend a hearty welcome to our Co-adjutor Bishop and sincerely trust his labors will be as fruitful as those of his predecessor, and that he may feel assured he has the earnest support and prayers of the women of the auxiliary.

There is a vast amount of work yet to be accomplished in our diocese and the women of the Auxiliary should consider it a duty and privilege to assist the Bishops in furthering their efforts. If the people of the diocese do not give them help, how can we expect the Board of Missions to assist us in this important work?

I will not take up your time with a lengthy address, but will simply make a few suggestions that I have gotten from the work in other dioceses. I would suggest that three more Vice-Presidents be added to our corps of officers. I feel that they would be of great assistance in carrying on the work. My plan is as follows: The first vice-president to assist the president and act in her place when necessary, as heretofore, with the additional duty of diocesan visitor; the second vice-president to supervise the work of the Junior Auxiliary, while the third and fourth vice-presidents would be in charge of the United Offering and educational work respectively. The Auxiliary Library would naturally be under the educational department. These should in no way interfere with the

secretaries and treasurers of these departments, but would work with them. I would also suggest, that to make this work more effective the various vice-presidents appoint their respective secretaries and treasurers, subject to the sanction of the president.

A very wise suggestion in regard to the time and place of holding our annual meeting has been made, namely that we hold it the day previous to the Diocesan Convention in the same city and church. This gives us the benefit of instructive addresses from visiting bishops and clergy and also keeps the clergy of the diocese more closely in touch with our work, and we with theirs. Both of these suggestions would require amendments to the constitution, and I leave it entirely to your judgment whether you deem them advisable.

A thing that would also materially aid the officers and greatly systematize the work would be the publishing of our annual report in pamphlet form which would contain a copy of the constitution, a list of branches with their officers and their statistics, and the official report of the secretaries and treasurers.

You may remember that last year Mrs. Nathan Barlow was elected to edit the Auxiliary column in the Church Helper and to her and Miss Bentley we are indebted for the interesting monthly accounts. Desiring to detract in no way from the excellent work of Mrs. Barlow, I would suggest that this office be appointive rather than elective, so that the president may have some one in her own city with whom she can frequently and personally confer in order to make necessary announcements.

These, my friends, are merely suggestions that I have been encouraged to make, but I trust that you will act upon them favorably, as they will undoubtedly further our work.

I thank you for your co-operation during the past year and pray God's blessing may ever rest upon the work of the women of this diocese.

Constitution.

Article I.

This Association shall be called the Western Michigan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

Article II.

The objects of this Association are by means of united and systematic effort to diffuse missionary intelligence and to increase missionary activity among the women of the Diocese; to unite existing societies in a common interest, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

Article III.

All parish branches of the Woman's Auxiliary shall be members of this Association. They shall pay to the treasurer of this organization yearly as dues, the sum of ten cents per capita for each member of said branch. Individuals from parishes in which there is no branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, may become members of this Association by the payment of the annual dues of ten cents. Two or more persons in the same parish or mission to constitute a society.

The fund thus created to be used as a contingent fund for defraying the necessary expenses of the Association.

Article IV.

A. Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer and Recording Secretary.

B. Sec. 2. The duties of the President shall be to preside at all the meetings, and have a general knowledge of the work of the Association. The duties of the various Vice-Presidents to be as follows: viz: The first Vice-President to take the place of the President in her absence and to assist in visiting. The second Vice-President shall

be the Diocesan President of the Junior Auxiliary, and the Babies' Branch. The third Vice-President shall be the Diocesan Treasurer of the United Offering. The fourth Vice-President shall be the Diocesan Educational Secretary.

The above Vice-Presidents shall appoint their own secretaries and treasurers.

Sec. 3, A. The duties of the Corresponding Secretary shall be to conduct the correspondence of the Association, render an account of the same at the annual meeting, and furnish any report required by the General Secretary at New York. The Recording Secretary shall keep a record of all Diocesan meetings and furnish reports of the same for the Diocesan paper.

Sec. 3, B. The duties of the Treasurer shall be to receive and disburse funds and render an account of the same at the annual meeting.

Article V.

This Association shall hold its annual meeting at the place of, and on the day preceding that of the Diocesan Convention. Delegates to said meeting may be appointed from each parish or mission by the local society, or by the Rector where there is no such organization. The purpose of the meeting shall be the election of officers for the ensuing year, the reading of the reports of the different Parish Societies, and such other business as may come before it. Besides the annual meeting for business, there shall be also on the same day a public meeting, when an address shall be delivered by some clergyman, invited by the President, and one or more papers on missionary subjects shall be read by ladies appointed by the President. A collection shall be taken up at the close of the meeting for the general purposes of the Association.

Article VI.

This Association shall be divided into two convocations, to be known as the Northern and Southern convocations, which shall both meet semi-annually in the fall and spring respectively, time and place to be appointed by the President and Corresponding Secretary.

Article VII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any annual meeting, by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present.

Article VIII.

All members of the parish branches, including the Junior Auxiliary and Babies' Branch, shall be invited to the annual meeting, but only two delegates from each branch, together with the Diocesan officers, shall be entitled to vote; provided, however, that delegates from the Junior and Babies' Branch shall vote only, on matters affecting their own work.

Article IX.

Parishes desiring to entertain the semi-annual convocations shall notify the President at the annual meeting or before the first of September, following.

Article X.

The President and First Vice-President shall be empowered to visit parishes and missions for the purpose of stimulating the work and organizing branches. Expenses for the same to be met by contingent fund, and if necessary, an assessment shall be made upon each of the branches.
