## PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

It is now one year since our last Annual Convention of the Woman's Auxiliary held in St. Paul's, Muskegon, where I was honored by being elected your president.

I feel assured that I did bring a real love of and interest in the work—the Woman's Auxiliary was my chosen field of activity, when I went into Trinity Church, Ft. Wayne, a bride, a good many years ago. But I do want you to know that I had misgivings, at the time of my election as to my capacity for carrying on, because of the state of my health which has not improved, and it is a real regret to me that I must give up before I have served the customary two years, which is a short enough term for the best good to an organization such as ours.

The first part of the year 1926 was fully occupied with rather a voluminous correspondence, which could be avoided to a great extent if each Parish will form the habit of bringing to Convention, a list of their officers, including the Box secretary, United Thank Offering treasurer and Church Periodical Club secretary if you have one; also a list of your pledges for the work in the ensuing year.

Getting material for the annual report, to the printer can be simplified with that co-operation of the individual parishes. And when your president or secretary receives this booklet please read it, pass it around, study it, and refer to it for whatever information you require concerning our work. It is the Annual report of these meetings, work accomplished during the past year and monies received and expended. It also contains list of Diocesan officers and addresses, list of parishes and parish officers, arrangement of Groups with the chairman, reports of all treasurers and secretaries, and the Constitution. The publica-



tion of it consumes considerable time and you spend a good deal of money for it and it is for your use.

The arranging of Group meetings followed the mailing of these reports.

I visited St. John's Parish in Sturgis one Sunday morning in May in company with Mrs. Scoffern. We had a talk with the rector and a few of the women following the service.

The next week a good Group meeting was held in St. Thomas, Battle Creek. A splendid program was arranged by the chairman, Mrs. Davis and I want to say here that one of the chief disappointments in these Group meetings, is that not all the parishes attend them. They can be so helpful to you, and I want to urge more strongly than ever that you do go to your Group meeting whenever it is called by your chairman and invite the meeting to your parish. Thus will your dormant interest be stimulated and you will be shown the help and benefit derived from contact with the work and problems in neighboring parishes.

The last week in May Mrs. Scoffern, our United Thank Offering treasurer (who has made of her work such a personal service, I find you all know so well) and I motored up through the Northern parishes of our Diocese, attending Group meetings in some, in other cases visiting individual parishes and in still others visiting individuals in a parish or village.

It was a glorious pilgrimage, but you have all read about it in the June Church Helper.

There were other Group meetings held which I was unable to attend, Grand Rapids, and in Holland. Splendid, splendid meetings they were in both places, resulting in the finest good and inspiration to those attending. September 30 I visited the Auxiliary of St. Luke's, Kalamazoo, it being their first monthly meeting of the year. They endeavored to make it a Group meeting and a good number with Mr. Hughes their rector from the Church of the Good Shepherd, Allegan, were present.

The plan to make a tour similar to our northern one, among the southern and eastern parishes of the Diocese was necessarily abandoned because of the state of my health, greatly to our disappointment.

I have given as much publicity as possible to the subject of our Corporate Gift this past year. Descriptive articles in our Church Helper, in my letters to parishes and in every talk at Group and Parish meetings. I must admit I have been rather amazed upon some occasions to find such a lack of understanding as to what it is all about. What is the Corporate Gift? It gives me the greatest pleasure to know that Mrs. Burkham, our National Chairman of this fund, is here and is to speak to us today, telling us all about the Corporate Gift.

In almost every letter from Miss Lindley, our National Secretary, as well as from many other sources, we are constantly urged to emphasize the need and efficacy of prayer and I want to sound the note to you, that you try to have one woman in each of your parishes take the responsibility of forming a prayer circle and distributing prayer leaflets, which are exceedingly helpful. Copies of all sorts of useful leaflets are listed in the back part of the Spirit of Missions.

Pray for the sick, the poor and the indifferent, for the prosperous, they are in special need of prayers and for the upbuilding of the Kingdom of God at home and abroad. One of our most beautiful points of contact can be the adoption of a missionary for whom to pray and work.



Names will be given you from the Church Missions House in New York City.

In October I had the delightful pleasure of a visit to an annual meeting of the women of the Diocese of Maryland in Baltimore, a meeting for the collection and presentation of the United Thank Offering.

There were present women from all but four of the parishes in the Diocese. The offering was fine, over \$5000, and addresses from our Presiding Bishop Murray, Dr. Wood of the National Council and others, were most inspiring.

We have heard so much about the Bishops' Crusade this past year. It is now in progress and our hearts are thrilled with the evidence of the high spiritual plane upon which it is being carried out. I trust that every one here has read so much of that which has been published in our Church Helper, The Spirit of Missions, The Living Church and other papers, that you are come with understanding hearts to the inspiring talk which will be given to us by Mrs. MacGregor about the part which our Woman's Auxiliary is playing in this marvelous crusade.

I want to urge you as representatives of parishes to familiarize yourselves more with the Summer Conferences held in various parts of the country, more particularly our own at Kalamazoo so wonderfully able to fill our needs for the training of leaders in church work, educational social service church school work especially.

Take advantage of the opportunity and try to send two, men or women, young or old, to that conference and see what they will bring back to you.

In importance to our missionary and social service work the carrying on of study classes stands very high. Your Educational Secretary is in readiness to direct you, will come to visit you upon request, to help arrange courses of study and giving you whatever information you may require as to procuring material, etc.

Opportunities for work in the Master's Vineyard loom high and we press eagerly on, longing to impart to others this vision and our enthusiasm. The reports from the various secretaries show you how well we do this work and to what extent the leaven of our zeal permeates the far reaching corners of this body, our Church. If we have done much, have reached the goal of our ambitions, well and good; if we have done too little, pray that we shall gird our loins and rise once more to the call for more consecrated effort, more earnest endeavor to surmount all real and fancied difficulties, that we may be ready to answer any call of duty.

And now I pray—let each of us frantically clear away from the door of our hearts the rank growth of the weeds of indifference and slothfulness, fling wide the door that the King of Kings may enter in.

## MINUTES OF THE 47th ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

---

### Diocese of Western Michigan

The 47th Annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Executive Council of the Diocese of Western Michigan was held at Grace Church, Grand Rapids, Michigan, January 18 and 19th, 1927, St. Mark's Pro-



Cathedral being the hosts, but owing to furnace trouble the meetings were held at Grace Church.

The Woman's Auxiliary met at the Baptist Church on Fountain St. Tuesday for luncheon at one o'clock, after which they were conveyed by autos to Grace Church Parish House.

At 2 o'clock Mrs. Peter Danhof, Field Secretary of the Daughters of the King, gave a talk on the aims and purpose of the organization.

At 3 p. m. we adjourned to the church, where we were given a cordial welcome by the Very Rev. Charles E. Jackson, and the new Rector of Grace Church, the Rev. Mr. Whittemore. Following, the Rev. Edwin G. White of St. John's Church, Ionia, conducted a most inspiring and helpful quiet hour and meditation.

We returned to the Parish House for discussions and business. The matter of electing or appointing the Chairman of the Groups was taken up. It was moved by Mrs. Franchot that the election of group Chairman and Officers be held at the Group meeting held nearest the Annual meeting. Carried.

Bishop McCormick came in and gave us a few words of greeting and organized the Convention. Mrs. Edwin Davis of Battle Creek, Michigan, was the next on the program and gave us a splendid report on the Racine Conference held last October, 1926.

A resolution relative to changing the date of the Annual meeting from January to May was introduced. Carried. Also resolution relative to the necessity of the continuance of the Church Helper to be presented to the Convention. Carried.

The President appointed the following committees:—resolutions: Mrs. Smelter, Lynes, Townsend. Nominating committee: Mrs. Johnson, Carney, Vosper, after which the meeting adjourned until Wednesday morning.

At 6:15 a lovely dinner was served for both Conventions in the Parish House by the Cathedral Guild.

At 7:30 a service and missionary address was held in the Church, with the combined choirs and clergy in the Procession.

The Wednesday morning session opened with the Holy Communion at 8 o'clock with Bishop McCormick as celebrant, assisted by the Rev. Fathers Jackson, Whittemore, Wilkinson and Archdeacon Vercoe.

Breakfast was served, following, in the Parish Rooms.

We adjourned at once for our meeting.

The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

The report of the Box Secretary, Mrs. M. V. Burlingame, was next read and approved. Mrs. Carney moved that the request for used clothing asked for by Mrs. Allen in report of Mrs. Burlingame be granted. Carried.

The report of the Treasurer, Mrs. N. DeKruyter, was read and approved.

The report of the Educational Secretary, Mrs. J. D. McCormick, was read and approved. The book for study this year is "Beyond the City Limits."

The report of the United Thank Offering Treasurer was read by Mrs. J. E. Wilkinson in the absence of the treasurer, Mrs. D. S. Scofield, and approved.

Report of the Francis Hillyer Lending Library by Mrs. R. H. Franchot was read and approved.

The report of the Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. A. S. Rowley, was read and approved.

The Church Periodical Club report was given by Mrs. W. E.



Powers, Grand Rapids, newly appointed Secretary of the Diocesan Branch by the Bishop.

A telegram of good wishes to the Convention was received from Mrs. D. S. Scoffern at San Diego, Calif.

The address of our dear President, Mrs. William White, was given at this time of her splendid work during the past year in spite of the handicap of ill health.

Mrs. Robert Burkham of St. Louis, Missouri, National Chairman of the Corporate Gift, gave a most interesting talk on the "Corporate Gift."

The President brought up at this time a very important matter of the school for the education of Missionary children at Kuling, China. Mrs. Jackson gave a few remarks at this time in regard to the school.

Fathers Bishop and Tunks asked for a few moments to bring an important matter before the Convention at this time for advice and counsel. They wished very much to continue the Church Helper, also to provide a new Archdeacon for the northern part of the Diocese. Whole sections in the northern part of the state are isolated and the need very great. The matter was to come before the Council that morning and they thought if the Auxiliary would pledge some definite assistance that would help considerable. Mrs. Carney moved that we pledge the sum of one thousand dollars to this cause. Carried unanimously.

At 12 o'clock we met in a joint session for noonday prayers and a business meeting, after which we adjourned to the Parish House for luncheon.

At 2 p. m. the President called the meeting to order. Report of the Nominating Committee by Mrs. Carney followed:

Mrs. Wilbur moved that the Secretary cast a ballot for the officers as nominated. Carried.

Mrs. Wilkinson moved that Mrs. White, the retiring President, be made a member of the Board. Carried.

Report of the collection taken was \$40.56. Mrs. Franchot moved that we give the collection for the membership at St. Hilda's school at Wuchang, China, which has been maintained for 38 years by Akeley Hall. Carried.

Mrs. Burlingame moved that we give \$50 to the school at Kuling, China. Carried.

Ionia extended an invitation by Mrs. White to go there for their May meeting. Mrs. Wilkinson moved that we accept the invitation of Ionia for the May meeting. Carried.

At 2:15 Mrs. Allan McGregor of Springfield, Ohio, gave us a wonderful and inspiring message on the Bishops' Crusade. Mrs. Wilkin-



son spoke on "The Day of Intercession" to be held March 4th, 1927, and the need of prayer.

The Resolution Committee reported at this time that we remember with love the service of Mrs. Frank Frost, South Haven; Miss Elizabeth Jones, St. Mark's, Grand Rapids; Mrs. Chas. E. Lafler, Trinity, Niles; Mrs. Mary Glover, St. Lukes, Kalamazoo; Mrs. Kate Holloway, St. Thomas, Battle Creek; Miss Louise Canwell, St. John's Ionia, whose lives were devoted to the interest and welfare of the Woman's Auxiliary and who have now passed to their rest beyond. Also resolved: that the Woman's Auxiliary of Western Michigan in meeting assembled, wish to place on record its regret in the departure of Mrs. Sargent from our ranks. Her rich mental gifts and her loyalty and devotion to the great cause of Missions made her always a strong face and an inspiration. May God bless her in her new field of labor. Resolved: that we extend our thanks and appreciation to our President, Mrs. White, for her splendid work in the past year and our deep regret at losing her. Also resolved: that we, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Western Michigan convey by this resolution our deep appreciation and gratitude for the delightful hospitality of St. Mark's Pro-Cathedral and the co-operation of Grace Church in allowing us to use their church during this convention.

Resolved: that we express to the Bishop and convention our thanks for the pleasure and profit received from various talks by the visiting clergy and other speakers.

Mrs. Franchot made a motion that the Group Meetings charge 50 cents for the luncheon for the visiting delegates. Carried.

Archdeacon Vercoe came in and said prayers with the induction of the new executive board. After which the meeting adjourned.

## **REPORT OF THE FRANCES HILLYER LENDING LIBRARY FOR THE YEAR 1926**

This report ends Dec. 1st., though the second year of the life of the Library, does not end until Mar. 1st., 1927.

The first nine months of the Library's usefulness shows a decided increase over the same length of time last year. The people throughout the Diocese are coming to know more about the usefulness and value of the Library, and are taking a keener interest in Church



history and literature, and a decided desire to become well informed Church members.

It has been interesting to note the influence their reading has had upon their friends, for in many cases I have had requests to send books along the line of questions those friends have asked them, in other cases when their friends have found out what they were reading such books, they have asked them to send for books for them to read also, saying they had never been taught very much about the Church, even though they had been Confirmed, and they somehow felt they could talk to a friend more freely than they could to their Rector, and sometimes they had no Rector to go to.

There is nothing that will build up a Church more or make better members than Church reading. Our Church people should know, and be just as well informed on Church matters as they are on the subject of their clothes, their husband's business or their own, and if they will use the books in the Library they will value and love their Church in a far deeper way, and be abreast of her condition and needs.

I find the younger people want books of information mostly, while the older people want these, they constantly call for books of devotional and inspirational nature. I sent out one of the truly great books of that type, last September, it has not come home yet, it has been passed on and on until I think every one in that town must have read it. One reader was so thrilled by it that she ordered several copies to give as gifts at Christmas time.

The Priests of the Diocese also, are finding the Library of value to them, and are using the books and magazines more and more, even though they live in the larger towns, they seldom can get Church books at the Public Libraries, and our books feed the hungry mind and inspire the worker afresh. During the past year three of the Priests have used the books to prepare lectures they were called upon to give. It is not always possible to either buy or borrow from friends, all the books one wants or needs, and in the Library many such books can be found, and requests for those not there, soon be filled, while the only expense to the reader, is the postage to and from the Library.

I have not called the Executive Board together through the year, as the books have been bought one or two at a time, as the money came in, and it did not seem worthwhile to ask busy people to come together for that little amount of business. In so small a Library as it is at present, the books must be selected with great care and to interest different types of readers, that we have of the best and the books kept up to date and fresh. A stale Library is like dead wood. At present it takes from \$100.00 to \$150.00 to run it as it should be run; this is a small sum when you think what it means to the life and growth of the Diocese, but the Parishes must support it. Just because your Church has not as yet used the books, is no excuse for not helping others to enjoy and profit by them, and you must remember that you voted to do your share towards its support, which is very little if each one does his part, and all the guilds in a Church should have a part in the offering made, and not the Auxiliary alone.

Since Dec. 1st., 1925, 184 books have been in circulation, as against 160 the year before, when magazines were also counted; so that if the magazines were counted this year the number would be well over 225. About 125 people have used the books. Fifteen people and groups did Summer Vacation reading.

Educational work has been conducted in various towns:

I—Travel talks on various countries and the Holy Land.

II—Program meetings

III—Talks by returned missionaries.

IV—Lenten Study Classes.

V—Current Events on Church Life.

VI—During Lent quite a complete survey and study of the history and conduct of the various parishes and missions in our Diocese was made by one parish.

VII—Bible Study class.

VIII—Study groups on "That Freedom."

IX—China's Real Revolution.

X—"Spirit of Missions."

There are just a few branches using the discussion method in their Study classes.

Almost all the branches have hopes of training leaders. A few have sent representatives to the Summer Conference at Hillsdale.

In answer to the question "What progress have you noted in your Auxiliary work?" I have had the following replies:

I—A number report that they seem to be drawing more of the younger women into the Auxiliary work.

II—A number report that they have increased their pledges for the new year.

III—That more interest is being shown in the missionary box work.

IV—"Better attendance at regular meetings and a willingness to fill offices."

V—"All are anxious to carry on our share of work."
