## SECRETARY'S REPORT, 1885-86.

---

Standing as we do to-day, upon the threshold of our sixth year, let us review briefly the record of the five years that are past.

In June, 1881, our Diocesan Branch was organized, with a representation, from eight parishes; and it should certainly be with great thankfulness to Him who giveth the increase, that we report to-day, fifty parish Societies working with us. During these five years we have given in money and boxes, \$42,288.51.

Of course, we would not imply that all this has been done because of the organization of our Society, doubtless much of it would have been accomplished had no Auxiliary ever existed, but it has permitted us to help systematize the work, and in many cases through our meetings to arouse and stimulate interest.

Our gratitude is always due to our Bishop, and Rectors of the Diocese, for their fostering interest. And shall we not also keep in affectionate remembrance our first Secretary and President, Mrs. M. L. Reid and Mrs. I. F. Quinby? We are building upon the foundation they so prayerfully laid.

Judging from the number of parishes yearly added to our list, we may look forward hopefully to a not far distant future, when every parish in the Diocese will have a branch Missionary Society, which if it cannot be a source through

which great gifts are sent out, may be a channel carrying in much valuable information concerning missions. We are never to "despise the day of small things," so we have an earnest message of invitation to all the small parishes—we ask them to give us their prayers, to send delegates to our meetings, to read the Mission House leaflets, and they will surely find ways to help a little in other directions.

With one single exception, all our money gifts during these years, have helped to build enduring structures—since learning how, after so many discouragements, Grace Hospital, at Seattle, Washington Territory is finally built, we may almost look for a successful revival of the Petersburg Orphanage.

Mrs. Watson writes from Seattle of the beauty and completeness of their new hospital building, and the usefulness of the gifts from Western New York. In speaking of the debt upon the building, she says: "I cannot but hope, that as the first encouragement in building came from New York State, from there also will come our final deliverance from debt."

To consider now what we have done during the year just passed—at our annual meeting last Fall, in Geneseo, Hope School, Springfield, Dakota was particularly recommended to the willing fingers and generous purses of the Diocese. We have sent for the benefit of the Indian pupils of this school nine boxes, and given in money through our Diocesan Treasurer, \$305.73.

Toward the deficiency for the salaries of our teachers at the South, we have given during the year, \$24.00; for Domestic Missions, \$601.75; for Indian missions, inclusive of the money sent Hope School, \$449.03; for Home Missions to the colored people, inclusive of money for last year's

deficiency, \$272.88; for Foreign Missions, \$322.30; and for General Missions, \$113.25; making in all for the year 1885 to 1886, 105 boxes and packages, valued at \$5,983.42; and in money \$1,970.89; which gives us a total of \$7,954.31 as the result of this year's work. It is proper to state here that one of our strongest parishes, which has always, heretofore made a large report, through the absence of its Rector and officers of its Missionary Society, has given us no record of the work we know that it has accomplished.

Three Diocesan Boxes, made up from packages from several places, have been sent during the year—one to Hope School, Springfield, Dakota, one to Mrs. M. E. Miles, Clover Depot, Virginia, for the colored people under her care, and one to a Domestic Missionary in Arkansas. Last January a meeting was held in St. Paul's Church, Rochester, which was largely attended, and many parishes from out of town were represented. There was another meeting in St. Stephen's Church, Olean, in May, at which Miss Emery, the General Secretary, was present—one of its pleasant features was the gift of an organ from Grace Church, Buffalo, for Hope School.

The death of Mrs. H. W. Burgwin, of Aspenwall, Virginia, who "passed away" in Richmond last July, was a personal loss to very many in our parishes. We had worked for her colored people during all the years of our existence as a Diocesan Society, her delightful letters brought us very near the writer, and we count it among the most blessed of our privileges, that we were able to help her so much.

Our report in black and white, of so many boxes, so much money, so many meetings, may not be particularly impressive, but colored by the many grateful acknowledgments of our help that come to us, and the assurances that

without it work could hardly have been carried on in some places, a deeper meaning is given these figures.

Let us, therefore, dear friends, enter hopefully and joyfully upon the work of the coming year, praying that our possibilities may be more and more the measure of what we accomplish, remembering always that our Lord has told us, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me."

## “THE SPECIAL FUND.”

In 1883 a fund was established in the Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary," called "The Special Fund," to be raised by voluntary offerings of one dollar a year, or more, or less, from every Churchwoman in the Diocese, to meet the appeals of the General Secretary, or other appeals, as for the support of missionary teachers, hospitals, etc.; that these offerings should be over and above regular contributions to Missions, or to the necessary money for sending boxes from parishes, but those giving regularly to special appeals are asked to devote a percentage of such offerings to this fund.

The money may be sent to Mrs. D. S. Chamberlain, Lyons, N. Y., Treasurer of the Diocesan Branch, or forwarded to her by the treasurers of parish societies designated for "The Special Fund." The amount of this fund to be announced at each annual meeting, and appropriated by a vote of the delegates, to such objects as the officers of the society, after consultation, shall suggest.

Should any one be willing to make an offering to this fund at any time, it would be gratefully received, and be of much assistance to the officers.

## CONSTITUTION.

---

### I.

The name of this society shall be "The Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

### II.

The object of this society is, by means of union and systematic effort to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

### III.

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this society.

The officers of this society shall be a **PRESIDENT**, **VICE-PRESIDENT**, **SECRETARY** and **TREASURER**, chosen by the diocesan association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

### V.

The President, or in her necessary absence the Vice President, shall call meetings and preside over them.

### VI.

The Secretary is expected to prepare an annual report for circulation in the diocese; to conduct the correspondence of the society; to give notice of meetings; and to keep the minutes.

### VII.

The Treasurer shall take charge of all money belonging to the society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting and oftener if required.

### VIII.

The members of this society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the Parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

### IX.

There shall be one general meeting of this society each year, on the last Wednesday and Thursday in September.

### X.

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

### XI.

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.
