SECRETARY'S REPORT.

1887-88.

This Harvest season sees us assembled again to tell over the sheaves it has been given us to gather for the Lord's garner. We bless Him that the year has seen so much done; and we beseech Him to let us be more useful during the year upon whose threshold we stand to-day.

As usual our boxes have gladdened many homes since we last reported to you. Forty-nine parishes tell us of one hundred and twenty-one boxes and packages sent, at a valuation of \$6,005.58. We have given in money \$1,566.34, making a total of \$7,571.92 as the monied result of our year's work.

Our meetings have been exceedingly well attended, and great interest has been shown; the first one was held at Jamestown in December, the second at Palmyra in May, the third at Avon in June. We have been greatly favored in having had Mrs. Schereschewsky with us so often during the year, and we cannot but feel that her earnest words will bring forth fruit in more generous giving, and greater self consecration among us all.

Many copies of the noonday prayer written by our Bishop, have been distributed, and we hope many more will be called for. It has been said, "If China is gained for the Lord, it will be through prayer," and as of China, so of all heathendom. The money, strength and ability to carry on this great work of evangelization may not be ours, but we can all pray, and we shall only know in the hereafter how much has been wrought by prayer.

"The poor lay brother's humble aid,
Who sat upon the pulpit stairs and prayed."

During the year two bound volumes of "Church Work" have been presented to the society by Mrs. A. T. Twing, Dorchester, Mass., as a nucleus for a missionary library; the feasibility of such an undertaking is under the consideration of a committee.

One interesting feature of the years advance, is an effort in the direction of children's societies. The matter was prominently brought forward at Avon, where a committee was appointed to determine how best such a movement could be furthered in our Diocese. Many of our parishes have very interesting organizations among the young women and children, but we should not be satisfied until every Parish in the Diocese has its band of young people preparing to carry on, and bring to greater perfection the work of the auxiliary.

Our correspondents have been of great assistance during the year, and in the words of our President, "We trust they will continue their good work. If they could in addition to their present labors, visit neighboring parishes and interest them in missions, much good might be accomplished." We are permitted to quote from the excellent report of one of these correspondents. After speaking of the fact that her notifications of meetings have not always been acknowledged, she says "Some of these places are quite small, yet, when there are ten or twelve earnest churchwomen who might gather together once a week or fortnight there appears no good reason why they cannot organize the nucleus of a society which can do something for missions, even if the amount accomplished does not exceed five dollars in value annually.

If we need any encouragement to continue in well doing after these eight years of missionary work, we may find it in the many, many grateful letters which come to us constantly. We are assured again and again that our boxes have made living possible to our missionaries.

We know what a blessing our money is when it provides Mrs. Jennings an assistant; sends Miss Mailes' Bible readers among the Japanese women; insures the lives of our foreign missionaries, and educates a Chinese, Japanese, African or Mormon child.

Shall we not say in looking forward:

" Surely, Thou hast more work for us to do,
Oh, open Thou our eyes
To see where Thou wouldst ever have it done,
And where it lies."

“THE SPECIAL FUND.”

In 1883 a fund was established in the “Western New York Branch of the Woman’s Auxiliary,” called “The Special Fund,” to be raised by voluntary offerings of one dollar a year, or more, or less, from every Churchwoman in the Diocese, to meet the appeals of the General Secretary, or other appeals, as for the support of missionary teachers, hospitals, etc.; that these offerings should be over and above regular contributions to Missions, or to the necessary money for sending boxes from parishes, but those giving regularly to special appeals are asked to devote a percentage of such offerings to this fund.

The money may be sent to Mrs. D. S. Chamberlain, Lyons, N. Y., Treasurer of the Diocesan Branch, or forwarded to her by the treasurers of parish societies designated for “The Special Fund.” The amount of this fund to be announced at each annual meeting, and appropriated by a vote of the delegates, to such objects as the officers of the society, after consultation, shall suggest.

Should any one be willing to make an offering to this fund at any time it would be gratefully received, and be of much assistance to the officers.

CONSTITUTION.

I.

The name of this society shall be "The Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II.

The object of this society is, by means of union and systematic effort to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III.

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this society.

IV.

The officers of this society shall be a PRESIDENT, two VICE-PRESIDENTS, SECRETARY and TREASURER, chosen by the diocesan association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V.

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI.

The Secretary is expected to prepare an annual report for circulation in the diocese, to conduct the correspondence of the society; to give notice of meetings; and to keep the minutes.

VII.

The Treasurer shall take charge of all the money belonging to the society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting and oftener if required.

VIII.

The members of this society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX.

There shall be one general meeting of this society each year, on the last Wednesday and Thursday in September.

X.

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI.

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.
