SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Again, dear friends, we are assembled to review the work of a year, and as we tell over the money given for missionary purposes—and the boxes sent, by the Church women of W. N. Y., let us ask ourselves, have we done our whole duty, have we returned unto Him a large enough portion of that which is His own?

We are sorry to report to you that all attempted at our last Annual Meeting has not been done. Our treasurer tells us of grave deficiencies. Will not every parish in the diocese, certainly the stronger parishes, connected with the Auxiliary, consider more the moneyed needs of our work? The General Board asks help of the Woman's Auxiliary, the secretary in New York appeals to the Diocesan Branches, but, of course, the Diocesan Branch is simply the parishes bound together for missionary work, and to the parishes these requests must come. So therefore to the parishes we appeal, begging them to ask themselves what should be their proportion of the money which the head of our society asks of us every year, so that when we come together after another year has passed we shall have no deficiencies to report.

We have sent more boxes this year than ever before, 114 in number, which, together with 37 packages, have gone to our workers in the Domestic, Foreign, Colored and Indian mission fields. The valuation of these boxes and packages is \$7,912.51. We have given in money \$1,640.68, which added to the value of our boxes makes a total of \$9,553.20 that we have sent away, but we have kept something at home too, as the result of a year's missionary work; our hearts have been quickened by the earnest addresses we have heard at our meetings, Mrs. Parker's beautiful paper upon "The Miracle at Cana," Rev. Arthur Locke's stirring address, all the helpful and encouraging words that our faithful friends, the Bishop and clergy of our own diocese, have said to us, and more than all we have been called upon to mourn together, and in the sympathy of sorrow have been drawn nearer the dear Master for whom we are working, and nearer to each other. During the year

three of our faithful friends has He taken to Himself—Rev. Dr. Windsor, of Hornellsville; Miss Mary W. Stacey, president of the parish society of Trinity Church, Geneva; and Mrs. Catherine E. Mathews, for many years presiding officer in the Missionary Society of St. Luke's Church, Rochester. Those dear familiar faces we miss from our midst; they were the earliest friends of the Woman's Auxiliary, and, even before its existence, devoted officers in the Missionary Societies of their respective parishes. We look thankfully back upon their example of consecration and faithfulness, and trust that when our hearts grow faint and our faith dim because of the discouragements of the way, that example may ever stimulate us to renewed diligence. Beside the annual meeting in St. Luke's Church, Rochester, our usual three sectional meetings have been held: the first one in Cuba, Dec. 5th and 6th; the second in Grace Church, Lockport, Feb. 13th and 14th; and the third in Christ Church, Rochester, the 15th and 16th of last May.

The reports this year show an increase of organizations among the children, and in connection with the May meeting in Rochester there was a large and interesting gathering of the little people.

These meetings have all been well attended and much interest has been shown in the work of the Auxiliary.

Many, many letters have come to us telling of the value of our ministrations to our co-workers on the western frontier; to the Indian schools; to the many missions of our Church among the colored people; to our hospitals and orphanages at the south and west; to our schools and Bible teachers in foreign lands; they gladden our hearts, and yet they humble us. Does all this represent much self-denial on our part? Is it worthy the deep gratitude it calls forth? How does it compare with what those who write the grateful letters give up?

Another year is opening before us to-day. Never was missionary work more encouraging. Never were the calls on every side more urgent. Never the need of prayer greater. "Stir up we beseech Thee, oh, Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may by Thee be plenteously rewarded."

"THE SPECIAL FUND."

In 1883 a fund was established in the "Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary," called the "Special Fund," to be raised by voluntary offerings of one dollar a year, or more, or less, from every Churchwoman in the Diocese, to meet the appeals of the General Secretary, or other appeals, as for the support of missionary teachers, hospitals, etc.; that these offerings should be over and above regular contributions to Missions, or the necessary money for sending boxes from parishes, but those giving regularly to special appeals are asked to devote a percentage of such offerings to this fund.

The money may be sent to Mrs. D. S. Chamberlain, Lyons, N. Y., Treasurer of the Diocesan Branch, or forwarded to her by the treasurers of parish societies designated for "The Special Fund." The amount of this fund to be announced at each annual meeting and appropriated by a vote of the delegates, to such objects as the officers of the society, after consultation, shall suggest.

Should any one be willing to make an offering to this fund at any time it would be gratefully received and be of much assistance to the officers.

CONSTITUTION.

I.

The name of this society shall be "The Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II.

The object of this society is, by means of union and systematic effort to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III.

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this society.

IV.

The officers of this society shall be a PRESIDENT, two VICE-PRESIDENTS, SECRETARY, and TREASURER, chosen by the diocesan association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V.

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI.

The Secretary is expected to prepare an annual report for circulation in the diocese, to conduct the correspondence of the society; to give notice of meetings; and to keep the minutes.

VII.

The Treasurer shall take charge of all the money belonging to the society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting and oftener if required.

VIII.

The members of this society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX.

There shall be one general meeting of this society each year, on the last Wednesday and Thursday in September.

X.

During the year three or four more sectional or special meeting may be called by the President at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meeting shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI.

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.
