SECRETARY'S REPORT.

In presenting our Tenth Annual Report let us begin with the very cheering outlook that meets us on the threshold of the incoming year; our pledges made so cheerfully at the last annual meeting have been abundantly fulfilled. For the first time in our history each special object has been provided for, and so promptly that your officers have had no anxieties upon the subject; but our box report is less than last year, and while we are glad that our monied interests have been so well looked after, we had hoped no diminution of boxes need have followed. However, some societies report boxes in process of being filled, and we trust the smaller figures of this year mean no lessening of missionary interest.

We have sent 138 boxes and packages, at a valuation of \$6,670.10, and given in money to our different missionary fields \$2,484.73, making a total of \$9,154.83.

Three meetings have been held during the year. At the annual meeting, in Trinity Church, Buffalo, we had the happiness of listening not only to our own Bishop but also to Bishop Thompson, of Mississippi. When we gathered in Medina for our first sectional meeting, January 15th and 16th, we were again greatly favored in having Bishop Talbot with us. The third meeting of the year was held in Bath, June 4th and 5th, when we heard with much interest the report of our missionary work in China and Japan, which Miss Sybil Carter gave us.

At the Medina meeting we were privileged to send these resolutions, congratulatory, to our Bishop: "Assembled in special meeting at this time, so soon after the gladsome celebration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the elevation to the Episcopate of our beloved Diocesan, we, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary, desire to give voice to our heartfelt congratulations to one another, that he who has so long time discharged the sacred office of a Bishop with such patient fortitude and inspiring devotion is still preserved to us in the rare

vigor of his matured gifts. Gratefully conscious of the abounding mercy of God in continuing to His Church the helpful presence of an overseer at once so ripe in scholarship, so catholic in sympathy, of such exalted ideas and continuing zeal, and who to these sterner virtues has joined the sweeter graces of such benign and winning gentleness, that all feel free to seek his counsel and aid, we cannot forbear to make this record ; and we claim the privilege of adding to the many and sincere expressions of loyal rejoicing our hearty and affectionate salutations on this joyous occasion, praying that Heaven's choicest blessings may ever be his, and that faithfully fulfilling his course, at the latter day he may receive the crown of righteousness."

Bishop Coxe replied in the following kind words: "Your most pleasing letter has reached me here, enclosing a copy from the minutes of the Auxiliary, of a resolution touching the recent commemoration of my twenty-fifth anniversary. From the ladies of my official charge, and from those who represent its zeal and fidelity in Christ, in their useful Association, in a degree so eminent, such expressions as they have sent me cannot be other than a most gratifying tribute. My days cannot be many, but their views of what *I am* (too partial by far) shall at least be kept before me, as a standard of *what I ought to be*, so long as the Lord may spare me in His service.

"Please assure them, one and all, of my grateful sense of their unexpected kindness. Our own tenth anniversary, as a diocesan society, is close upon us; on the 1st of June we shall have accomplished our first decade. Let us make this tenth year memorable, by striving to enlist as many workers as possible ; if only we might so enlarge our boundaries as to include every parish in the diocese, what a strong working force we should represent ! One diocese, among the fifty-nine associated with the Woman's Auxiliary, has a branch in every parish. Shall this not be said some time also of Western New York ? If each one of us would make an effort in that direction, surely it might be brought to pass, and our Auxiliary not only be *represented* in every parish, but every parish, every year, do a little to help forward the missionary work of the Church. It cannot perhaps be much, but a diligent doing to give of our little would never interfere with work at home. Of the 120 parishes and missions that make up our diocese, 69 may be said to have a connection with the Woman's Auxiliary ;

there are still 51 parishes and missions that we desire to have with us. Of course, they are in many cases feeble folk, but *we* are not to despise the day of small things, and *they* cannot afford to lose the element of growth which missionary work always proves. Probably of these 50 parishes there is not one that could not contribute \$1.00 every year, either in money or sewing to the work of the Auxiliary. Shall we not resolve ourselves into a Committee of the Whole, and see if we cannot increase the number of our parish organizations until they shall include every mission station in the diocese?"

The growth of societies among the younger workers is very encouraging. A large number of our parishes report organizations among the juniors, and we are glad to record that this is due in large measure to the efforts of the committee upon junior work. May it continue its excellent efforts until every parish in the diocese has its band of young missionaries, who shall be trained to take and more than fill our places, when that day shall come to us in which no man can work.

There is another matter to which we wish to call your attention in our reports; one page is devoted to an explanation of the "Special Fund." Will not each delegate peruse that page, consider the value of such a sum of money to be disposed of at the annual meeting, and ask herself what she individually can do to increase this offering?

Dear friends, every year brings its warning that the portion we are to do of the King's business may require haste. Again, the example of those gone before is brought home to us, as we see their empty places. Mrs. T. F. Rochester, who beside being a prominent officer in her own parish society, was the first choice of the Auxiliary as President; Mrs. W. K. Allen, who so often delighted and instructed us with her valuable papers, and was also one of our correspondents; Sister Harriet Dayton, that faithful friend to our society, and to missionary work; Mrs. C. J. Fillmore, although not so long associated with our diocese, still so devoted to its missionary interests. All these have entered into rest within the year. We have need of the comfort the communion of saints gives, for our store in Paradise is ever growing.

Our thanks are always due those faithful friends to the Auxiliary, the rectors of our parishes; at every meeting their valuable counsel

helps us to keep the onward way with better courage, and apart from the missionary intelligence our gatherings afford us, we could ill lose the helpful words we hear from the clergymen of our diocese.

The new year of work which this meeting ushers in is full of promise. If each one of us will realize her individual responsibility to help onward, be it by much or little, so that it represents her best endeavor, the Kingdom of God, it may be also a year of generous fulfillment.

“THE SPECIAL FUND.”

In 1883 a fund was established in the “Western New York Branch of the Woman’s Auxiliary,” called “The Special Fund,” to be raised by voluntary offerings of one dollar a year, or more, or less, from every Churchwoman in the Diocese, to meet the appeals of the General Secretary, or other appeals, as for the support of missionary teachers, hospitals, etc.; that these offerings should be over and above regular contributions to Missions, or to the necessary money for sending boxes from parishes, but those giving regularly to special appeals are asked to devote a percentage of such offerings to this fund.

The money may be sent to Mrs. D. S. Chamberlain, Lyons, N. Y., Treasurer of the Diocesan Branch, or forwarded to her by the treasurers of parish societies designated for “The Special Fund.” The amount of this fund to be announced at each annual meeting and appropriated by a vote of the delegates, to such objects as the officers of the Society, after consultation, shall suggest.

Should any one be willing to make an offering to this fund at any time it would be gratefully received and be of much assistance to the officers.

CONSTITUTION.

I.

The name of this society shall be "THE WESTERN NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY to the Board of Missions."

II.

The object of this society is, by means of union and systematic effort to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III.

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this society.

IV.

The officers of this society shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and two Secretaries, Corresponding and Recording chosen by the diocesan association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V.

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI.

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the society, and prepare a report to be read at the annual meeting.

The Recording Secretary shall give notice of meetings, keep the minutes, and prepare a manual for circulation in the Diocese.

VII.

The Treasurer shall take charge of all the money belonging to the society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting, and oftener if required.

VIII.

The members of this society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX.

There shall be one general meeting of this society each year, on the last Wednesday and Thursday in September.

X.

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI.

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.
