SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Ten years ago, September 20th, the first Annual Meeting of our Auxiliary was held in the church where we are assembled to-day. Dr. and Mrs. Windsor welcomed the young society, and that welcome was the first of many greetings, many words of cheer and counsel that we have listened to from those dear friends. Words of mine utterly fail; I cannot put into language how much we love, reverence and owe to them both. These anniversaries bring the here and there very near together; we hardly know which are in Paradise, and which still with us, the place is so filled with memories.

The Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was then but four months old, the correspondence of which brief time was embodied in a report prepared and read by Mrs. Catharine E. Mathews, of beloved memory. She is now with Christ. She told us of seventeen societies in the Diocese engaged in missionary work; they reported \$3,704.44, as representing the work of a year, in money and boxes. She also gave an account of the meeting for organization, held in Rochester, the first of the preceding June.

This was our beginning. Under such fostering care our Society had birth, and it is good to bear in mind who our early friends were, that we may the more closely emulate their devotion, and carry on with ever greater efficiency their work.

The record of this one-tenth year is of unusual interest in many ways; it shows the formation of societies or the development of interest in a goodly number of small and so-called feeble parishes in our Diocese. This is a subject for devout thanksgiving. We must not consider our work even well begun till every mission station in Western New York is in working association with the Auxiliary, not that we wish to burden them above that they are able, but the missionary spirit must be fostered, and the sowing beside all waters is a positive injunction.

How do we know but in the smallest parish the seed may take deepest root, and rise to bless us in a valuable missionary abroad or devoted worker at home?

We are deeply grateful to those faithful officers who have visited the smaller parishes, to tell them of the methods and aims of our Society. More of the same kindly interest would result in better knowledge of the needs within our own borders, as well as in disseminating missionary intelligence.

There have been three meetings during the year, the annual one in St. Paul's Church, Rochester, the winter meeting in St. James's Church

Buffalo, January 28th and 29th, and the summer one in Watkins, June 10th and 11th. At the first our own Bishop, Dr. Langford, Miss Carter, Mr. and Mrs. Graves, made the addresses. Bishop Hare was with us at Buffalo, and also Mrs. Graves. At Watkins it was delightful to welcome Miss Emery again to our Diocese.

These meetings were all exceedingly well attended, and beside the speakers from a distance, our Diocesan clergymen had much of deepest interest to say to us.

We are happy to report that the Enrollment Fund has been generously remembered in some of our parishes, and we hope another year will add further to our contributions toward it.

During the year, associated meetings of the city parishes have been held both in Rochester and Buffalo, valuable papers and missionary letters read, and two boxes sent as the result of this effort. We feel our city work has received a decided stimulus through these meetings, and we heartily commend the method to all towns having more than one parish. The stronger ones can thus strengthen the weaker to the great gain of both.

The work of the Junior Society has been a constant advance, and this year we are to add the report of its committee to the other printed matter in our manual.

Much of the growth of these ten years is due to the kind encouragement of our Bishop and the clergy of the Diocese; without their constant help we could never have accomplished so much in boxes and money as the ten past records show.

This year a greater number of parishes than ever before tell us of work done; more boxes have been sent, and more money contributed than in any previous year. The boxes and packages are valued at \$7,457.71, and we have given in money \$3,398.16, which sum is \$1,302.67 in excess of our report for any other year.

But we can take little credit to ourselves in looking backward. We might have done much more had we made greater effort, and now for the next ten years, what may we not accomplish if only we will try by every means in our power to inform ourselves of the needs and conditions of our missions, talk about them, strive to make their story as interesting as we can to those who know and care little for these "Things of God."

Let us not be satisfied to follow the holy *doctrine* which St. Paul taught, but let us emulate his *missionary zeal*; we shall not probably be called upon to undergo "Stripes above measure, prisons more frequent, deaths oft." At most we may be called peculiar, and that we read was how of old our Heavenly Father desired His children should be known, as, "Holy unto the Lord thy God, a peculiar people unto Himself." JUNIOR REPORT.

There are now in Western New York fifty societies working together, as a Junior Auxiliary, each parish having its own name and organization, and under the charge of an older person, who will represent them in the Woman's Auxiliary. This includes all the young people in the Church who are interested in its missionary work, who are not yet old enough to be members of the other society, but by this education are preparing themselves to take their places as working members of the Church. It is a school-room, so we must not look now for great results. We must wait for the fruit of our labor in these branches. We will never know the good it is accomplishing, as boxes and money give little idea of its value in the Church.

There are no positive rules, except that each society shall work part of the year at least for missions, and shall report to our committee, which acts under the advice of the officers of the Woman's Auxiliary, and is appointed each year by them. This committee is made up of ladies from different sections of the Diocese, with a chairman. To these ladies the chairman sends anything of interest for the Junior Societies in their section, and they see that the heads of their societies receive it, saving postage, and having a central person whose interest it is to look after all her societies, calling a meeting of her section, stirring new zeal, organizing new societies in places near her, prepared to tell her section who to work for, receiving the money for our united work as a Junior Auxiliary. The committee for the past year have been Mrs. Louis Washburn, who represents the Rochester section, and who has all kinds of missionary literature needed for the work; Miss Irving, of Geneva; Mrs. Elisha Smith, of Buffalo; and Miss Hart as chairman. We have among our societies Mission Bands, King's Daughters, "Ministering Children's League," and Friendly Societies, and joined with these older, stronger branches, last January a young branch sprouted, which promises to bear beautiful fruit. This is the Babies' Branch, and their name is "Little Helpers." It is not a parish society, but belongs to the Diocese. Each baby that joins at its baptism begins its missionary work, for by this act it becomes a member of the great Missionary Society, The Church. Its first gift is five cents to the Enrollment Fund, which makes it a member of this "Little Helpers' Band," the Babies' Branch of the Junior

Auxiliary. The little helper then receives a mite box in which it is to put a penny every Sunday. At the end of the year the amount is divided into three parts for our three great fields. The babies' gifts will go to the objects, the Junior Auxiliary support, the Sybil Carter Scholarship in the Jane Bohlen school in Wuchang, China, Little Fountain Duke, the colored boy in Virginia, in Mrs Jaeger's Orphanage, and in Diocesan work for the organizing of Junior Societies in the mission churches. The money given by the individual societies last year toward this work was \$3.20, and was spent for work for the Junior Societies in these churches.

We are deeply interested in our Auxiliary in Diocesan missions, and hope in God's good time to have a Junior Society not only in every mission church, but wherever a few church families are gathered together.

Our interests this year have been in Bishop Hare's Indians, and those at White Earth, Minn., in the colored work, Mr. Cassey and Mr. McDuffy in North Carolina, Mrs. Jaeger and Mrs. Buford, Virginia, and in hospital works, Mrs. Clarkson in Omaha.

Twenty-five boxes have been sent by the Junior Auxiliary this year. Their value with the small packages amounts to \$894.17. Fifteen hundred cards were made at Easter-time and sent to Bishop Hare's Indians, and at a joint meeting in Rochester, in St. Luke's Guild room, when our eight Rochester societies had the pleasure of a visit from Mrs. Graves, gifts amounting to \$8.00 were given Mrs. Graves to take home with her to China. Among these were eight towels, each bearing the name of one of our societies. At the sectional meeting in Buffalo in St. James, which we all remember with so much pleasure, we had a gathering on Wednesday afternoon of the ladies interested in the Junior work, and later in the church, a children's meeting, with addresses by Bishop Hare and Mrs. Graves. At this meeting \$12.00 was taken, and \$8.25 of this has been used for the expenses of the Junior Auxiliary. We promised at this time, on Thursday, at the business meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, \$10.00 for the Enrollment Fund, and with the Babies' help have made it \$11.40, and mean the amount shall increase.

In money we have received: For Sybil Carter Scholarship, \$52.57; for the Jaeger Scholarship, \$70.00; for the Enrollment Fund, \$11.40; for Junior Work, \$3.20; for Lace Workers, \$2.00, making a total of \$145.17 for objects in which we were interested as a Diocesan Society; \$247.67 with gifts of individual societies.

“THE SPECIAL FUND.”

In 1883 a fund was established in the “Western New York Branch of the Woman’s Auxiliary,” called “The Special Fund,” to be raised by voluntary offerings of one dollar a year, or more, or less, from every Churchwoman in the Diocese, to meet the appeals of the General Secretary, or other appeals, as for the support of missionary teachers, hospitals, etc.; that these offerings should be over and above regular contributions to missions, or to the necessary money for sending boxes from parishes, but those giving regularly to special appeals are asked to devote a percentage of such offerings to this fund.

The money may be sent to Mrs. D. S. Chamberlain, Lyons, N. Y., Treasurer of the Diocesan Branch, or forwarded to her by the Treasurers of parish societies designated for “The Special Fund.” The amount of this fund to be announced at each annual meeting and appropriated by a vote of the delegates, to such objects as the officers of the Society, after consultation, shall suggest.

Should any one be willing to make an offering to this fund at any time, it would be gratefully received and be of much assistance to the officers.

CONSTITUTION.

I.

The name of this society shall be "THE WESTERN NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY to the Board of Missions."

II.

The object of this society is, by means of union and systematic effort to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III.

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this society.

IV.

The officers of this society shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and two Secretaries, Corresponding and Recording, chosen by the diocesan association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V.

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI.

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the society, and prepare a report to be read at the annual meeting.

The Recording Secretary shall give notice of meetings, keep the minutes, and prepare a manual for circulation in the Diocese.

VII.

The Treasurer shall take charge of all the money belonging to the society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting, and oftener if required.

VIII.

The members of this society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX.

There shall be one general meeting of this society each year, on the last Wednesday and Thursday in September.

X.

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI.

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.
