SECRETARY'S REPORT.

This harvest season as it comes year after year, making us count the sheaves, and tell over the work of a twelvemonth, fills us with mingled gratitude and regret ; gratitude, that we have been given the opportunity for doing so much, and regret, that such opportunity has not been more abundantly used. The year has gone ; now we can only utilize the gratitude and regret as incentives to greater effort in the new year upon which we enter to-day.

Many causes for thankfulness crowd upon us as we begin a report of our year's work ; first of all comes the admirable showing of the Junior Society, which will be presented in detail by its representative. We are glad to give this tribute to its excellent work ; it has been in many cases the pioneer in missionary interest, preceding not only the older society, but in one or two cases the church itself. It is good to think that the Lord's chosen work should be the nucleus about which the Lord's Church may gather.

Each year shows new names among our reporting parishes, and if some, who told us of faithful work a year ago, have been hindered from helping this year, others have made their numbers good, and we trust next year that charity, which should never be remiss at home, will find time and money for work outside again.

Two meetings have been held during the year. The first in Trinity Church, Geneva, last January, where we listened to Rev. Mr. Partridge's thrilling account of work in China, and more particularly in Wuchang.

June saw us assembled in Jamestown, where we were glad to welcome Miss Emery again to our Diocese and listen to her inspiring words. Beside these general meetings, both Rochester and Buffalo have called their parishes together for missionary counsel. Very successful joint meetings of the city parishes have been held, where missionary letters were read and addresses made by the clergy. We trust these reunions will grow in interest and become more and more valuable helps in our missionary work. When we hear of the many men of the diocese banded together as lay brethren to help onward

the work of the Church, shall we not be stimulated to profit by such an example, and consider ourselves so commissioned as members of the Auxiliary, that we will feel specially set apart to preach the gospel of both love and work for missions, not only in the general meetings of the society, not only in our own parishes, not only in the joint city meetings which we so cordially commend, but also going out into the outlying—so called—weak parishes, to tell them of the manifold needs and interests of our work.

Our last year's pledge to Miss Emery represented a venture of faith, for not enough was promised at the Annual Meeting to meet her requests of us; but we have thankfully to chronicle, that our Treasurer's report shows every deficiency made up, and though it would have represented less anxiety to your officers if the last Annual Meeting had seen these special objects fully provided for, it is a source of devout thankfulness that you have so generously remembered them during the year.

We have not only contributed our money and given our boxes to the mission fields, but we have also sent what is more precious, our daughters, to work for His neglected ones. Miss Marian Taylor represents Western New York among the Indians of Minnesota, and Miss Ellen Adwen goes in January to the same interesting work. These young women, after due preparation in the Deaconess House in Philadelphia, and previous association with the "Girls' Friendly Society" in one of our own parishes, drawn especially to the work through Miss Carter, promise to be valuable helpers under her guidance. Would indeed others might be moved to give, what is better than gold or garments, a life for the cause of Christ.

The Enrollment Fund has not been forgotten. Our Treasurer tells us that \$700 and more has been this year contributed for it, which, with \$1,000 given last year, allows us to send some \$1,800 as our part of the united offering made by the Woman's Auxiliary at the time of the General Convention next month.

We have been called to mourn together. That kind friend to our society, and generous helper in all missionary work, Mrs. Peter Porter, of Buffalo, has gone to her reward during the year. The faithful steward has fallen on that sleep He gives to His beloved, and we have her blessed example to be thankful for. Each year brings its lesson of the "little while" given us to do His work. To which

of us will the call come during the next year? Let us try faithfully to discharge our stewardship in whatsoever it may consist. Is it money? Shall we not give generously? Is it personal influence? Let us use it strongly for God's own chosen work. Is it physical strength? We will employ it in running His errands and bearing the burdens of His weaker children. Is it only power to pray? Ah! that is best of all; like Jacob, of old, we can say, I will not let Thee go except Thou bless this, Thine own missionary work.

The "Church Work" column has been faithfully carried on during the year; and will not each member of this society feel it her duty and privilege to take the little paper, through which the Auxiliary will, from week to week, have its word to say, keeping us in touch with each other, and our missionary workers, at home and abroad?

REPORT OF JUNIOR AUXILIARY FOR 1892.

Three thoughts have impressed themselves upon us this fall in considering the "Missionary Board," Woman's Auxiliary and Junior work. Our mutual dependence one upon the other, our need of true consecration, and the unity of the work. We are all one body in Christ and every one members one of another, and the Church can never come to the perfect measure of the fullness of Christ until we each one become vitally interested in the growth of Christ's kingdom and depend upon God's strength and then upon each other.

The Junior work and that of the Auxiliary is one. The representative heads who meet in council are all working members of the Woman's Society. The young people are to fill your places, and are looking to you for approval and sympathy. You, as a Mother Society, have greater responsibilities put upon you, so we must not ask you to help us carry on our work, for we must only promise what we can perform, but we shall be so happy to see your faces at our meetings and receive a word of approbation or advice. May we ask that this new year each member of the Woman's Auxiliary will resolve to visit once the Junior Society in her parish, and make herself acquainted with its work, thus giving encouragement to the head of the society and letting the young people feel you have their interest in mind.

The Junior Society is expected to help, even if it be with a very small gift, in supporting the scholarships and also to work part of the year for missions. There is a period after the Christmas box is sent, the first of December and Ash Wednesday, when they can work for their own parish, and again after Easter, but the important teaching to bring before the young people is, "Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others."

The Junior Auxiliary is under the care of a committee, with a chairman appointed each year by the Woman's Auxiliary, and always acts under the advice of its officers. Diocesan boxes have been sent to Rev. I. I. Lloyd, Abbingdon, Virginia; to Mrs. Hunter, Raleigh, N. C.;

and Mrs. Clements, Rosebud Agency, South Dakota and Rolla, North Dakota. The names Abbingdon, Va., Lynchburg, Va., "South Dakota," appear oftenest in our reports.

There are 56 Junior Societies in Western New York, composed of more than 1,500 young people who are working together in our Auxiliary. They are not all children, for all who are not working members of the Woman's Auxiliary should belong to the Junior Society, from the babies who are working as "Little Helpers" with their gifts right on through life. There is no period when our work ceases. The value of the work this year is \$1,086.89. The money given by them as a Diocesan Society was \$158.12; \$60 for the Jaeger scholarship in Lynchburg, Va.; \$40 for the Sybil Carter scholarship in the Jane Bohlen school, Wuchang, China; \$15 for Ko-San in S. John's orphanage, Osaka, Japan; \$14.50 for the Enrollment Fund from the Juniors, and \$14 from the babies, our 150 "Little Helpers." They have also given \$6.41 for the Junior work in the Diocese, and \$5, which was divided between Miss Carter's lace workers and Bishop Walker's Indians. At a joint meeting of the Juniors in S. Luke's, Rochester, we had the pleasure of giving Miss Mailes \$10, and at a joint meeting of the East Side Churches in Buffalo, \$4.18 was given for the Enrollment Fund. The "Little Helpers" are to be a great power for good in Western New York; with their penny each Sunday in their mite box they are helping the Junior Society support their scholarships and also to strengthen the growth of the Junior Auxiliary.

The Junior work can be carried where the Woman's Society cannot yet reach, either because of lack of members or money. These Little Helpers, the babies of the Church, are to furnish the means to carry on this work. Last year Holley, Webster, Charlotte and Caledonia were all four furnished with work by their pennies. The society in Holley of ten members is taken care of by one of the Babies' Branch; while those in Charlotte and Webster are to be in memory of two other Little Helpers. The society in Webster they named the "Missionary Pioneers." It is made up of 20 girls between eleven and seventeen years of age. There is no church, not even a mission, only strong churchwomen, and through the influence of this junior work this summer lay reading is carried on every Sunday afternoon. A Sunday-school of five classes has been organized and meets in the little school-house. We have grown this year in experience and

strength, but let us press forward as we have never done before to make Western New York a Diocese full of the missionary spirit.

Let that 12 o'clock hour of prayer be the means by which it is brought about. There will not be the same discouragements nor lack of interest when the electric current of prayer is set in motion for missions. Hearts will be on fire with zeal, gifts will pour into the treasury, lives will be consecrated and there will be unity in the work.

“THE SPECIAL FUND.”

In 1883 a fund was established in the “Western New York Branch of the Woman’s Auxiliary,” called “The Special Fund,” to be raised by voluntary offerings of one dollar a year, or more, or less, from every Churchwoman in the Diocese, to meet the appeals of the General Secretary, or other appeals, as for the support of missionary teachers, hospitals, etc.; that these offerings should be over and above regular contributions to missions, or to the necessary money for sending boxes from parishes, but those giving regularly to special appeals are asked to devote a percentage of such offerings to this fund.

The money may be sent to Mrs. D. S. Chamberlain, Lyons, N. Y., Treasurer of the Diocesan Branch, or forwarded to her by the Treasurers of parish societies designated for “The Special Fund.” The amount of this fund to be announced at each annual meeting and appropriated by a vote of the delegates, to such objects as the officers of the Society, after consultation, shall suggest.

Should any one be willing to make an offering to this fund at any time, it would be gratefully received and be of much assistance to the officers.

CONSTITUTION.

I.

The name of this Society shall be "THE WESTERN NEW YORK BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY to the Board of Missions."

II.

The object of this Society is, by means of union and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III.

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this Society.

IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and two Secretaries, Corresponding and Recording, chosen by the diocesan association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V.

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI.

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and prepare a report to be read at the annual meeting.

The Recording Secretary shall give notice of meetings, keep the minutes, and prepare a manual for circulation in the Diocese.

VII.

The Treasurer shall take charge of all the money belonging to the Society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting, and oftener if required.

VIII.

The members of this Society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX.

There shall be one general meeting of this Society each year, on the last Wednesday and Thursday in September.

X.

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI.

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.
