CONSTITUTION.

I.

The name of this Society shall be "The Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II.

The object of this Society is, by means of union and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and to encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III.

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this Society.

IV.

The officers of this Society shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer and two Secretaries, Corresponding and Recording, chosen by the Diocesan Association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V.

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents, shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI.

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and prepare a report to be read at the annual meeting. The Recording Secretary shall give notice of meetings, keep the minutes, and prepare a manual for circulation in the Diocese.

VII.

The Treasurer shall take charge of all money belonging to the Society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting, and oftener if required.

VIII.

The members of this Society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX.

There shall be one general meeting of this Society each year, on the last Wednesday and Thursday in September.

X.

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI.

This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.

OPENING ADDRESS.

By MRS. P. N. NICHOLAS,

President of the Woman's Auxiliary for the Diocese of Western New York, at
the Annual Meeting, November 14, 1901.

Fellow Members of the Woman's Auxiliary of Western New York:

There are a few things which I should like to say to you this morning before we enter upon the formal work of our meeting, and, first of all, a welcome. It is a very great pleasure to welcome you to our little city by the lake, and to this parish—the first to be organized in Western New York, of all those which have had an unbroken existence. I am sure that in this friendly greeting I also express the feeling of our sister parish, St. Peter's, which has been aiding us at this time in hospitable rites. And you are welcome at this annual meeting, when we sum up the past and forecast the future, and strive to help one another to strength and to encouragement.

The year just closed has been marked by two special efforts. The first of these was the opening of Mission Classes in our larger cities and in a number of the smaller towns. All praise to the women who have so faithfully sustained them. Some such informing and vitalizing work, whether in the study or the guild-room, *must* be done by our members in addition to all that we may be privileged to hear from the pulpit, if we would be ready to do our part in the rapidly growing Missionary work of our day and generation.

The second special effort of the year was for a complete organization of the work of the United Offering on the lines of the admirable Pennsylvania Branch.

I asked our Second Vice-President, Mrs. White, if she would be the head of a sort of Bureau, which would be in correspondence with the Parish United Offering Treasurers. This she kindly consented to do. Then I asked each rector to appoint a treasurer in his parish if this met with his approval. Fifty-eight treasurers have been the result, one of whom is, for the present, the rector himself. We have contributed \$2863.34 to the United Offering this year, against \$2321.00 three years ago; a gain of \$542.34. I think we owe this gain in our gift largely to the new organization, and I earnestly hope that the Auxiliary will value Mrs. White's self-sacrificing and efficient labors. Since she is willing to devote herself to this work, I should like to see her formally appointed to the charge of the United Offering in the same manner as are the officers of the Junior Auxiliary. And I am convinced that it would be desirable to have the list of United Offering Treasurers given in the Manual.

The time will come when you will wish to divide the responsibilities of our Diocesan Treasurer—because you will recognize the great growth of our work through the United Offering. You will then find that a good preparation has been made for such a division in the founding of this United Offering Department. In this, again we should be following the excellent and successful method of Pennsylvania, which I believe New York has also adopted.

There has been another matter of general interest in the preparation of our past in the Historic Exhibit in San Francisco. Each branch of the Auxiliary was asked by Miss Emery to prepare an exhibit which should show the beginnings of church life in its own Diocese, and also to present to the women of the California Branch all duplicates which could be spared to mark the visit of the whole Auxiliary to the Pacific coast, and to lay the foundation for a noble historical collection.

This undertaking involved us in much correspondence and a very great deal of labor. For a number of reasons it was determined to take the parishes organized in the first twenty-two years in Western New York, and oddly enough, we found that just twenty-two parishes had been organized during that time.

A Committee consisting of Miss Grace Bird, of Buffalo; Miss Griffith, of Rochester; Mrs. Boynton, of Geneseo; and Mrs. Earnest Cleveland Coxe, of Geneva, was formed to help your president—each member being asked to provide dates and facts and photographs of certain churches. These contributions were arranged by the Geneva members of the committee, and a brief historical note was compiled as an introduction. This exhibit was, in its very small way, a more systematic effort at history than anything else that I saw at the exhibition. It was admirably placed in the hall of the house which the California women secured as their headquarters during the Convention. We gave that copy of the exhibit to the San Francisco women to be kept in the Church House, and we have prepared a duplicate for our own Branch. It is now hung in the lower Guild-room of this church, where I hope you will all examine it.

This matter of the exhibit brings me to the subject of the four great meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary in San Francisco. They were of deep interest. I desire to tell you about all these; but not at this moment, for we must now begin the regular work of our session.

I must not fail, however, to express my deep appreciation of the support given me during the past year by our Auxiliary, and most especially by the officers, whose duties have brought them into frequent, and often daily communication with me. The fact that every suggestion has been gladly received and willingly carried out, has not only relieved me of some of the burdens which I should otherwise have had, but has made me realize, as never before, the deep interest of my associates in this missionary work.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

AS we come together for this adjourned meeting, a little later in the season than usual, when the work of the past is almost forgotten by the fresh undertakings already begun; let us pause a moment to review the finished work and thank God we were privileged to do so well

Last year was one of unusual vigor of purpose, and its accomplishments exceeded our best expectations. It was not a sudden bound, but the work has been for several years continually on the increase.

At the presentation of our last report, sixty-three branches had prepared boxes from the eighty branches registered on the Secretary's books. This year seventy branches sent in their reports, nine of which were either new or had never reported before.

The total valuation of boxes this year was \$6,708.33, a gain of over one thousand dollars.

Then in comparing ourselves in Miss Emery's Annual Report, out of seventy-nine Dioceses, Western New York stands sixth.

No Foreign box was sent this year, but amidst the usual preparation of work for the Domestic, Indian and Colored Fields, a ringing cry came to us

from the Jacksonville fire sufferers, and a wonderfully quick response was made, when within a week five hundred dollars worth of excellent clothing was sent. Archdeacon White acknowledged it most gratefully as the finest which had been received.

The work for our own Diocese was about half as much as last year.

Seven boxes were prepared at the small value of \$215.10.

But what was the cause of the increase? Undoubtedly the love of doing our Master's work, with a greater degree of knowledge of it, learned by deeper and more constant study. And now for one word for the coming year. Let us not be content with last year's successes, but realize that so far, comparatively little work has been begun for the happy Christmas boxes of cheer which we usually send, and that we must rouse ourselves and believe that whatever our effort, in the same proportion God will give the increase.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY.

1900-1901.

IT is no slight coincidence that has called us together in this parent parish of the Diocese, to enter upon the work of a new century, nor that this our first report to our new president should be presented in her own church home. From her we look for the inspiration to better things which one fresh from the great Triennial Convention cannot but impart, and to her and the members of the Woman's Auxiliary we bring our record of another year's work ended, its successes and its short-comings. Our first work for the year was sending the Christmas boxes in the Buffalo and Geneva Section to St. Paul's Normal and Industrial School, Lawrenceville, Va., and in the Rochester Section to the Lower Brule Reservation, S. Da. The Junior secretary found it possible to be present in St. Mark's Church, Buffalo, where on Dec. 1st, the gifts were gathered in. A service in the Church preceded the assembling in the Parish House, where on tables and benches the many useful, pretty and well made articles were displayed. The rooms were crowded with happy children and one unacquainted with the spirit of our Juniors might have wondered at the joy of giving so manifest on all faces. A treat of ice cream and cake gave a true Christmas flavor to the occasion, and the children went home glad of the privileges which membership brings. The Rochester box was packed in St. Mark's Church, Dec. 7th, and again the Junior Secretary was an invited guest. The plan was to have the children inspect the gifts in the afternoon, and the Heads remain for a basket tea and an informal meeting. The stormy weather, however, prevented the children from coming in large numbers, but their gifts were their representatives, many and good, and the Heads greatly enjoyed the picnic element of the tea and the pleasant chat about methods of work. The packing was entrusted to experts, but all assisted in collecting the gifts, and the frequent exclamations of pleasure made one feel our work indeed twice blessed, blessing him that gives and him that takes. The Juniors' fervor was later put to the test when week after week passed and no acknowledgments were received. Finally the Geneva Section sent for publication a letter from the recipient, whose critical illness of many months had prevented the expression of thanks so deeply felt. Bishop Hare vouched for the other that everything was received and appreciated. The Juniors had, however, long ere this turned their attention to Easter boxes. Acknowledgments of these boxes followed promptly upon their arrival and the children felt, we are sure, well repaid for their faithful work.

The Batavia Section was at the beginning of the year divided between Rochester and Buffalo, thus bringing us more into conformity with the divisions of the Archdeaconries. The Geneva Section continues to set all an example

of what can be accomplished by the many small societies when loyalty is the watch-word of the workers, and untiring devotion, through sickness as through health, the motto of the beloved leader.

Two new branches have been organized during the year, one at Christ Church, Rochester, and one at the Ascension, Buffalo. We regret to add that the branches at Trinity and St. Paul's, Buffalo, have found it impossible to continue to work with us. A delightful discovery was brought to our notice in July by the corresponding secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary when the children of St. John's, Honeoye Falls, were found to have sent a box to Archdeacon White, Jacksonville, Fla., valued at twenty-five dollars.

Although not an organized branch we consider them junior workers, as they are to assist in one of the Christmas boxes which is being prepared.

The Mary Hart scholarship in Nara, Japan, has been discontinued, owing to the closing of the school and will be transferred to some other place. The Juniors have therefore given to but four scholarships this year. Our United Offering of one hundred dollars, in its beautifully decorated envelope, was entrusted to the care of our President, and was placed by her on the alms basin at the Triennial Convention in San Francisco.

The Diocese numbers fifty-five branches, and of these forty-one have reported contributions to boxes, two to scholarships only, and twenty-seven have contributed to both. The total valuation of our boxes amounted to \$661.85, and the treasury received \$181.66. The SWORD AND SHIELD proves its value to the branches by the frequent contributions sent to the editor. In it all the letters from the missionaries for whom we have worked have been published, also reports of sectional meetings, accounts of special occasions in the branches, and information concerning our treasury, and we feel that we owe largely to it our sustained interest in our work and in one another. It is sent to every head whether a subscriber or not, and a few branches pay the subscription price of ten cents. With so strong a force of Juniors, and with such united action among the leaders we may well hope to enlarge our borders this coming year.

REPORT OF THE BABIES BRANCH.

1901.

THE Woman's Auxiliary, the Juniors, with their Kindergarten, and the Babies Branch, are every three years realizing more fully the beauty and importance of united work; and in the great gift of \$105,000.00 in San Francisco, we see the growth in this thought.

In 1892, one Babies Branch sent its gift of \$14.00 for the United Offering. Western New York was then the only Diocese with that little circle of Helpers. In 1898, the Babies Branch in eleven Dioceses contributed \$181.41. In 1901, 30 Dioceses had a part in the gift of \$532.89 sent to San Francisco. The number of Little Helpers is difficult to ascertain. We have 52 Dioceses with the Little Helpers at work, 5 added since June. The second General Report gives all these statistics. We have been uniting more and more in our work, and find a growth, not only in the amounts, but in the interests. There has been an increase of gifts from the *whole work* of \$7,155 27 since 1898.

Our own Western New York work is not standing still, and you will see by the little letter, that we have this year received from the boxes \$360.25 in June; and since the publication of the letter, three parishes have been heard from, and their gift was added to our United Offering of \$56.00, making it

\$75.00. The beautiful envelope was painted by Mr. Wm. Rebasz, of St. Luke's, Rochester. The envelope itself was given by our President, Mrs. Nicholas, to her Little Helpers.

In connection with the United Offering, I must just speak of the gift of 1500 little booklets on the United Offering, which the Babies Branch sent out all over the country. It was paid for by a memorial from three mothers who wanted to help through their little ones, with this gift of thanksgiving. It was beautiful—the work that was done by our Little Active Helpers in Rochester, and it may surprise you to know that since this Babies Branch was started in 1891, in Western New York, \$2,409.19 has been given to missions, that would not, perhaps, have been heard from if God had not opened the tender, loving hearts of mothers and God-mothers to give *with* their little ones here, and for those whose names are now written in the Lamb's Book of Life. There is no limit to any work when done in His name; and the penny, with God's blessing, changes so quickly its value.

We have our Gaylord Hart Mitchell scholarship in St. Paul's College—the boy we started with ten years ago, in the Orphanage. In our Colored work, we have two Kindergarten children in St. Augustine School, Raleigh, N. C.; we support a cot in St. Agnes Hospital at Raleigh, N. C., with the nine other Dioceses. We have given, with eleven other Dioceses, a marble font for the Cathedral at Kyoto; another font, with New York, to Africa. Next year, all the 52 Dioceses are to unite in working for the children's Ward in the new hospital in Shanghai. Each year, the Western New York branch has a part in the Junior work, and helps with the five pledges giving five dollars to each. We rejoice that we are to add one more for Africa and that the name of this new scholarship is to be the Helen M. Halsey, the President of the Woman's Auxiliary so many years, and loving mother of the Junior Auxiliary and Babies Branch. One important factor in this kindergarten work is the education of the children in their responsibility to their diocese. Each year a font is given to a new mission in one Arch-Deaconry and a gift of money to the other Arch-Deacon, to be used as he thinks best. Mr. Dantzer, our missionary to the deaf mutes, is always remembered each year.

The font this year was sent to Dundee in the Rochester Arch-Deaconry, and the \$10.00 given to Mr. Bragdon, who said it was to go for the Indian Church. This \$10.00, we believe, is to have an influence for the future growth of our diocese, for with God's help it is to unite us in a work for the Indians at our own door.

The gift was followed by a visit of the Little Helpers' leader to the spot where the church is needed at Irving, New York. Baptism and the responsibility of a God-mother brought about the Babies' Branch, and because of that \$10.00 from the Little Helpers their friend was called to stand for five Indian children and promise in the sight of God and 200 Indians she would see they were brought up to know and believe all things that a Christian ought to know and believe to his soul's health, therefore one important part of the Little Helpers' work for the new year is this church. It is diocesan work. It is Indian work.

We have already gathered since the 5th of July \$125.00 from many sources, which will be reported in full in next year's Little Letter. Over \$40.00 special from the Little Helpers.

Please send your gift from the new wooden boxes very promptly at Whit-sun Tide, and may I ask that the memorial names be written very plainly.

When you send a gift please remember that something has to be taken from the gift, if it is not a draft on New York or postal order.

"A little child shall lead them" means so much to our circle of Little Helpers, as it stands at the head of our memorial list. He has led us in a wonderful way, and the influence of His little ones is doing much for the older people.

They are the future church and we cannot afford to neglect teaching them the very best and giving our best time and thought to the work.

Pray for your Little Helpers. God is blessing them, indeed, and may we be workers together, one family in Christ.

Christ Church, Rochester, has made great progress in its Church Periodical work this year. It had been without a Librarian for a year or more, consequently little was being accomplished in this line. It is now in a most flourishing condition, having 71 contributors on its list.

The following parishes are without Librarians some of them having been vacant for years. I give the list hoping that representatives of these parishes who may be here to-day will feel impelled to start up the work again and not let such a valuable missionary factor die out entirely: Grace Church, Lyons; St. Mark's Church, Newark; St. Mark's Church, LeRoy; St. Peter's Church, Westfield; St. Luke's Church, Branchport; St. Paul's Church, Rochester; Trinity Church, Rochester; Zion's Church, Palmyra; St. Andrew's Church, Rochester; Grace Church, Nunda; Christ Church, Pittsford; Grace Mission, Belfast; Epiphany Church, Rochester; St. Stephen's Church, Olean; Christ Church, Albion.

I will be very grateful if any of the ladies belonging to these parishes will either volunteer to act as Librarians themselves or recommend suitable persons for the office.

In view of the fact that fifteen parishes have nearly if not quite given up this work, I want to impress upon you the great importance of the C. P. C.

No auxiliary is complete without its complement, the C. P. C. The two should go hand in hand together.

The bountiful boxes which the Woman's Auxiliary send out every year should always contain a goodly amount of inspiring literature. The mental and spiritual needs are quite as important, if not more so, than the physical.

At a recent meeting of the C. P. C. the Rev. Dr. Green, in the course of his remarks, said: "There is this peculiar value about a book, that when you read and get out of it all you can, it is just as good for the next person. A coat or gown is not so good when it is used over and over again, but a book is. You get all the value that you can out of a book, and all you get out of it you leave for the next person, and the value is not in the least diminished, provided the leaves are there. Books do really, over and over again, clothe the naked and feed the hungry as no other clothing and food can do." I would make this a direct, personal appeal to each woman here. Are you doing what you can for the C. P. C.?

THE SPECIAL FUND.

IN 1883 a fund was established in the "Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary" called "The Special Fund," to be raised by voluntary offerings of one dollar a year, or more, or less, from every churchwoman in the Diocese, to meet the appeals of the General Secretary, or other appeals, as for the support of missionary teachers, hospitals, etc.; that these offerings should be over and above regular contributions to missions, or to the necessary money for sending boxes from parishes, but those giving regularly to special appeals are asked to devote a percentage of such offering to this fund.

The amount of this fund will be announced at each annual meeting and appropriated by a vote of the delegates to such objects as the officers of the Society, after consultation, shall suggest.

Should any one be willing to make an offering to this fund at any time, it would be gratefully received and be of much assistance to the officers.
