CONSTITUTION

I

The name of this Society shall be "The Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II

The object of this Society is, by means of union and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this Society.

IV

The officers of this Society shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a United Offering Treasurer, and two Secretaries, Corresponding and Recording, chosen by the Diocesan Association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents, shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and prepare a report to be read at the annual meeting. The Recording Secretary shall give notice of meetings, keep the minutes, and prepare a manual for circulation in the Diocese.

VII

The Treasurer shall take charge of all money belonging to the Society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting, and oftener if required.

VIII

The members of this Society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX

There shall be one general meeting of this Society each year, on the second Wednesday and Thursday in November.

X

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, or at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.

DISTRICTS OF THE DIOCESE

The Diocese is divided into six districts, each district under a secretary appointed by the president, and each with its box-directress to whom parish secretaries apply for work.

The objects of this division are a quickening of Auxiliary life, all over the Diocese, through reaching parishes far from the customary centres, and holding there such meetings as may give them the information and inspiration that come from Diocesan meetings, also through the establishment of a system of administration equally applicable to conditions of work in village, town or city.

The aim of the Woman's Auxiliary is to occupy every parish that is willing to do something for missions in this organized way.

The division is made as far as possible according to counties. Railroad connections, however, make it impossible to follow boundaries arbitrarily.

The six districts are as follows:

BUFFALO DISTRICT: Angola, Buffalo, East Aurora, Lancaster, Lockport, Medina, Williamsville, Middleport, Niagara Falls, North Tonawanda, Gowanda, Depew and Youngstown. (Erie and Niagara Counties.)

ROCHESTER DISTRICT: Rochester, Brockport, Charlotte, Pittsford, Fairport, Scottsville, Union Hill, Sodus, Wolcott, Albion, Holley, Honeoye Falls, Spencerport. (Monroe and Orleans Counties.)

GENESEO DISTRICT: Geneseo, Avon, Dansville, Mount Morris, Batavia, LeRoy, Oakfield, Warsaw, Stafford, Perry, Caledonia. (Livingston, Wyoming and Genesee Counties.)

GENEVA DISTRICT: Canandaigua, Clifton Springs, Shortsville, Phelps, Geneva, Palmyra, Lyons, Clyde, Newark, Dresden, Penn Yan, Branchport, Himrods, Dundee. (Wayne, Ontario and Yates Counties.)

BATH DISTRICT: Bath, Canaseraga, Corning, Hammondsport, Hornell, Addison, Catharine, Montour Falls, Watkins. (Steuben and Schuyler Counties.)

OLEAN DISTRICT: Olean, Salamanca, Mayville, Chautauqua, Angelica, Dunkirk, Fredonia, Jamestown, Westfield, Belmont, Belvidere, Ripley, Ellicottville, Cuba, Silver Creek, Wellsville. (Chautauqua, Cattaraugus and Allegany Counties.)

THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

To the Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:

My dear associates: While I took no time to address you formally at the annual meeting recently held in Corning, I desired to emphasize three matters of which I shall now write.

First, *the Apportionment*: For several years we have been helping our parishes and our diocese toward the complete payment of the Apportionment set before us by the Board of Missions as Western New York's fair share in the missionary undertakings of the Board for each year. The Rev. Mr. Davis, secretary of the Diocesan Committee on General Missions, wrote a year ago to thank us for the steady giving of the \$2,000 asked of the whole Auxiliary toward this diocesan apportionment. We are continuing faithfully to do our part. We have not only given \$2,000, but have added to it liberally each year. Mr. Davis said, "With your coöperation next year the committee hopes to place our diocese on the Honor Roll of the Board of Missions, and for that coöperation we gratefully ask again." Members of the diocese responded readily to the request of one day's income for the Board's emergency fund, which is credited on the apportionment. Other gifts of money were made. The apportionment has been paid for the year just closed, and Western New York is on the Honor Roll of the Board of Missions. Can we help as well again? Let us try. It will need hard work and deep personal interest.

Second, *the United Offering*. We are now entering on the third year of the collection of the Offering, which will be presented next October at the great service in St. Louis. These over-and-above gifts of thankfulness for special mercies, and of the gift of Life as well, should be pressed by all of us, and made matters of prime importance this year at every meeting.

Third, *the Pledge of \$100 for Diocesan Missions*. We appear to be strong enough now to carry forward all these plans and promises, and still give this sum this year for missions in our own diocese. This money is to be divided equally between the two archdeaconries. It may be that the missions we try to assist in this special way may come to feel an increased interest in our general work.

I have received, since the meeting, a very earnest appeal from Bp. Hunting, of Nevada, for assistance. He wants this diocese to help him pay the salary of a successor to Miss Marian Taylor, who went, I believe, from Rochester, to work among the Indians at Pyramid Lake, Nevada. Bp. Hunting says that he is a new bishop, and does not know how to bring about the support of this particular work unless Western New York will help. The Indian agent at Pyramid Lake will take the work out of Bp. Hunting's hands and give it to some other religious body for support if the bishop does not prove quickly that he can maintain it. Bp. Hunting has the right woman to fill this position but not the money to support her. Can we not always give a little more for such a good cause? I commend this appeal to the district meetings, and personal giving of the Auxiliary.

And may God's blessing rest on every effort of the year.

REPORT OF THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY

The thirty-fourth annual meeting of the Western New York branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in Christ Church, Rochester, Nov. 11th and 12th, 1914.

Fifty-one parishes were represented by nearly 200 delegates.

The speakers at the Wednesday evening Missionary Service were the rector, Rev. D. L. Ferris, and the Rev. Franklin J. Clark, Recording Secretary of the Board of Missions.

On Wednesday the three secretaries of the Junior Department held meetings under the direction of the three heads, Miss Hart, Miss Sanders and Miss Arnold.

Thursday's meeting was opened with the Holy Communion, followed by the business session. The speakers were the Rev. Mr. Clark, Rev. Cameron Davis of Trinity Church, Buffalo, Mrs. John Ely, who spoke for St. Mary's School, Shanghai, and Miss Bessie Mead of Tokio, Japan.

A new \$50.00 pledge, as a memorial to Bishop Coxe, was founded at this meeting, to be used for the education of an Indian girl at St. Elizabeth's School, Ft. Hall, Idaho.

The semi-annual meeting was held at St. Mary's on the Hill, Buffalo, June 2d and 3d. The speakers were the rector, Rev. Geo. F. Williams, Rev. Lyman P. Powell, president of Hobart College, Rev. H. A. McNulty of China, and Bishop Walker. The diocesan officers were the guests of Bishop and Mrs. Walker at the See House for the 11th Annual Conference on March 9, 1915. The day was most pleasantly and profitably spent discussing informally the business of the Auxiliary.

The box-work has been satisfactory. One hundred and forty-eight boxes were sent to 22 different stations and 22 families. The value about \$6,000.

This year let our aim be even better boxes, a real friendship formed with those for whom we work, and earnest prayers for their success.

REPORT OF THE DIOCESAN EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

To the President and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary of Western New York:

To begin the summary of our Educational work along the lines of Missions Study during the past year so far as it has been reported to me, I wish to tell you of two classes which seem to me to be an encouragement to us all, as well as a refutation of the well-worn excuse—"We can do nothing, we are so few." One of the classes referred to was held at a District Meeting last June in a century-old parish, its church set like a pearl high up in the green hills of Schuyler County—away from a railroad—away from the busy haunts of men—its people coming from farm homes within a radius of several miles—but near in heart and soul to the activities of the Church—earnest in doing what the Church asks, in the way it asks.

The second class in my mind was composed of nine members in a little town of the Rochester District, and was started by a visit from the Leader of the District and carried on most successfully by a parish leader chosen from their group. One of the members asked her for reference material and was recommended to study the four Gospels and the Acts for first-hand information. The interest of the class in their subject was vital, and a tangible result was an offering of six dollars for the Emergency Fund of the Board. Ought not these instances make us very reluctant to dismiss lightly an appeal that we organize or lead or join a study class in our parish?

Two classes which were held at District Meetings last summer after the year's report was closed will be included here.

The usual Demonstration class was given at the Annual Meeting in November, the subject being The Philippines, because the text-book for 1915 was delayed.

The Demonstration classes at District Meetings and in different parishes of the Rochester District by visiting groups of women have resulted in the formation of new classes and have been of great benefit to the work. This would be an excellent idea to develop in other districts of the Diocese and would be in keeping with the request for extension work which I have just received from Dr. Gray.

By the courtesy of Rev. Mr. Ferris of Christ Church, Rochester, and the assent of the leader of his class, we were privileged to invite to its sessions two women from every parish in the district. Forty-eight came and were trained for leadership in parish groups. This was an exceptionally fine class—its leader calls it "a coöperative class"—the work was so cheerfully and generally taken up by its members, who presented to the leader at its close a written testimonial signed by all the members.

Voluntary offerings of money to the United Offering, to Bishop Brooke, to Bishop Restarick and to the Emergency Fund were made directly by some of the classes.

Christ Church, Corning, again heads the list with 233 members divided into eight groups—each group doing its work as planned by the Leader of the entire membership with conscientious care and thoroughness in the several methods employed.

As a rule the official course was adopted, with the help of Mrs. Hobart's book—Then and Now—showing results of Missions as seen in our own stations. We have worked loyally on this course and I hope it will advance the work laid out for us next year—which is a review of the Conquest of the Continent, Japan Advancing and the Emergency in China, especially considered with Social Aspects.

A revised edition of the *Churchman's Why and How of Missions* will be issued during the summer for those who prefer it to the review course.

It is hoped that Bishop Rhinelander's course on the Bible will be ready for the following year, so we must not feel disappointed at the postponement.

To summarize we find 52 parish branches of the Auxiliary having taken up the study of Missions in some way during the weeks of Lent, with a total membership of 1019 and an average attendance of 835 which latter only shall I record. My report is not entirely complete owing to the fact that my card of inquiry has in two or three cases been unanswered.

In closing I would urge that every branch send its delegate to the Conference for Church-workers at Geneva, July 3-10 for the expert training in Missions Study which will be given daily. It is an opportunity to study under Church auspices with inconsiderable effort and expense, and will bring rich fruit for next autumn.

CHURCH PERIODICAL REPORT

The Church Periodical Club is a society formed for the purpose of supplying periodicals and books to those of the Clergy and Laity who are unable to procure good literature in any other way. It is organized along diocesan and parish lines, having at present over 1100 parish branches.

Through its individual members it places in the hands of the clergy and isolated laity current periodicals and books that have already been read by their owners; provides the same kind of material for reading and club rooms, Mission Schools, army posts, battle ships and hospitals, prisons and other public institutions. It also keeps in circulation over 175 travelling libraries.

One of the things we are struggling with is the Christmas card list, which is assuming huge proportions. If every person who buys cards for her friends would buy just one extra, and give to the C. P. C. librarian, there would be no difficulty in securing what is needed. Made over cards can be used in some places but they should be well done.

During the last year 163 periodicals have been sent regularly: 211 contributors, 232 theological and secular books, 510 odd magazines and papers, 65 Christmas and Easter cards, 152 picture cards and calendars, 28 Victrola records, 12 picture games, 10 boxes, contents not counted, four travelling libraries, 38 new books from Bath librarian, playing cards from Mrs. Jackson, Clifton Springs, not a Bible or Prayer Book and Hymnal was offered this last year.

He urged us to think of the women first, for as is the woman, so is the man; and every little package of printed matter we send is really a message from the Father. He uses human beings to send the message. Even a copy of *Vogue* might be a blessing from God. He had known men who've gotten started on the right path through reading *Life* or *Puck*. Just because it makes them remember that human life is the same everywhere, and that touch of kinship with other lives gives them fresh courage to try again.

I want to express my deepest gratitude to the friends who by their never failing generosity have made it possible for us to give this help to these laborers among Christ's needy ones at home and in far away lands.

JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

REPORT OF THE INTERMEDIATE SECTION, 1914-15

The report of our Western New York Intermediates of one year ago closed with an account of the three especial efforts which we were planning to make the centre of our winter's work, and to the accomplishment of which we hoped to devote our best energies. They were the increasing of our membership 25%; the, at least, partial support of a special missionary, and a new emphasis upon the United Offering. You will be interested, I am sure, to know the measure of our accomplishment in these directions.

First as to membership—We have more than made the 25% increase—it is a little more than 30%, which means that about 150 girls have been added to our ranks. It can not be considered a net gain, however, as four lapsed branches have brought a decrease of about 60. We have a present membership of about 550 girls. Five new branches have been added to our list—at Dunkirk, Angelica, Perry, St. Luke's Rochester, and Mt. Morris, and two branches from Section Two have lately been received, the Bp. Thomas branch of St. Paul's, Rochester, and Dansville, making a present total of 30 active branches. Our lapsed branches are a matter of deep concern, and we are planning to make an earnest effort to reorganize them, where it seems possible and wise.

Coming now to our second effort, the supporting of a special worker in the field has appealed strongly to the girls, and we feel that it was not due to them that the entire amount was not raised. \$119.65, however, was given towards the salary of Rev. Frederick Lobdell of Rutherford, N. C. Recently the culmination of interest was reached when the Older Girls of both Rochester and Buffalo were brought face to face with their fellow-laborer, and heard from him of what together they are accomplishing in the mountains of North Carolina. One girl is reported to have breathed a sigh when the talk was over and to have exclaimed, "O, I wish I could be a missionary!" And we wish so, too!

With our United Offering effort we have not done so well. Eleven branches have given \$79.97, a gain of \$17.53 over last year. One year from now we hope to tell you that many more United Offering meetings have been held, that each individual girl has had her share in the giving, and that there has been an offering of Life as well as of means.

Our Pledges have amounted, this year to \$183.27, one "special" of \$16.17 has been given to work among the Wyoming Indians, and \$43.15 to District and Diocesan expenses. The total money gifts have been \$442.21. In the Box-work, we have in each district worked with Section Two, sending boxes to Alaska, to the Helen Dunlop School, Arkansas, to the Indians in South Dakota and Utah, and to Mountaineer and Colored Missions—the entire value being \$245.84. The total of money and boxes amounted to \$688.05, a gain of \$62.69 over last year.

Joint meetings for the girls, with box-packings and Officers' Conferences have been held, while the January Institute and Geneva Conference brought unique opportunities for training and deepened inspiration to our very doors.

The Annual Corporate Communion at the close of our year's work, again brought us together in a loving and conscious fellowship.

The Study Class record is one of promise and encouragement. Nineteen branches have had the Discussion Classes, using, generally, "The Child in the Midst" or "Social Aspects." Two branches report Program meetings and one missionary readings. This means, we hope, that our members will be incapable of unintelligent effort, that the impulse and desire to help are being aroused, and that if we Leaders are faithful, each girl may hear her own especial call to her peculiar share in the Triumph of the Kingdom.

We deeply regret the withdrawal of Miss Smith and Mrs. Robins from active leadership, and feel that we can best show our appreciation of their splendid service by making their work increasingly fruitful.

Finally, our plans for the future include the efforts for the United Offering and for our lapsed branches of which I have spoken, the attempt, which is ever with us, of entering new fields, and the making a beginning in meeting that most difficult problem of winning the girl of ability, of college training, of comparative leisure, to an appreciation of her stewardship, and to a realizing sense of the unused forces within her reach.

Again, we would count upon your continued interest and your sympathetic sharing in our endeavors.

REPORT OF SECTION II

The past year in Section II of the Junior Department has not been one of great gains, but there are many most encouraging features.

Though three districts have been without leaders for some time, the work has been done by committees, and except in a few instances the branches are going on as usual. Miss Smith and Mrs. Robins will be greatly missed, but both will continue a connection with the work of the Junior Department, so that what seems a loss may be a gain in the end. New district leaders are Mrs. Donald Symington as chairman of the Committee of the Rochester District, Miss Ann Prophet in the Geneseo District, and Miss Smith who will act as Chairman of the Buffalo Committee.

Sixty-seven branches have been active during the year—a total gain of two over last year. Some have lapsed. New branches have been formed in Dansville, Salamanca, Ellicottville, one new branch in Charlotte, one in St. Paul's and one in Christ Church, Rochester. The total membership has not been ascertained, but 39 branches report 726 members. Eight branches report a gain in membership.

Section II raised \$336.70 for pledges. In spite of the fact that some pledges were greatly reduced \$75.00 more was raised in Sections II and III than ever before. The United Offering was \$31.68 and boxes to the value of \$675.11 have been sent to North Carolina, Utah, South Dakota, Wisconsin, Arkansas, Kentucky and Minnesota. This represents only one side of the work, giving; in prayer and study the year has also been one of progress.

The Letter Leaflet and Honor Standard sent out early in the year were intended to set a standard for the parishes. These with the Report books kept by the leaders have made it possible to know definitely what each branch is accomplishing. Thirty-seven branches are on the Honor Roll; 10 branches answered "Yes" to every question in the Honor Standard; five more qualified for first place by failing in only one question; 10 failed in only two questions, thus making second place; and 12 made third place. But the most gratifying thing these reports showed was the moral earnestness, high ideals and aims of the leaders in this work of character-building through our three lines of work: prayer, study and giving. Surely work inspired by such ideals and done so conscientiously must reap a rich harvest for the Church of the future in lives consecrated to the service of the Master.

Emphasis was placed last year on social service. Many branches report work for the Church Home, flower-mission, Y. W. C. A., parish work and baskets sent out at Christmas and Thanksgiving. Special meetings have stimulated interest in the United Offering. Programs for the year show special meetings devoted to information about the scholarships, box-work and the history of the Junior Auxiliary. The Olean District held its first box-packing in October; and the other districts have held most interesting meetings, Bishop Lloyd being present at one of these. Some branches report special meetings during Lent to emphasize the prayer-side of the work and other leaders report greater interest in the spiritual side of the work.

Thirty-seven branches report regular study classes on "The Child in the Midst," "How the Cross goes Round the World," and "Building the City."

Courses on the Bible were used in some branches. Reports show greater originality in methods in the study work than ever before. The Institute, held at Trinity Church, Rochester, was well attended. As many of those present were leaders of new branches, the conferences were given to methods of building up the work. Several leaders attended the Geneva Conference of Church workers, and it is hoped each year will see a large attendance at this conference. No Institute will be held this year, so the secretary will have more time to devote to extension work.

The watch-word for the year is "A live branch in every parish." To come anywhere near realizing this aim will mean systematic planning, earnest effort and prayer, and the coöperation of all. Some beginnings have been made in personal visits to parishes, the appointment of assistants to district leaders and correspondence between new leaders and those more experienced. May the year be most fruitful in results.

LITTLE HELPERS' REPORT, 1914-15

"The Little Helpers," Section I, have chosen for their watch-words for the coming year, "Rooted and grounded in love." Not human love alone, for that changes and fluctuates, but Divine love, for we would have our "Little Helpers" grow up into Him.

The preparation of the ground is our work for this year,—to see it is in the right condition for such valuable roots that give promise for future growth in the home, the church, the world.

The mother's heart is one piece of ground to be prepared for this sacred plant. The root cannot be neglected or it will only show for a little while above the surface and then wither, unless watched and watered and cared for in its beginning.

The Font Roll is another place where we should watch an opportunity to plant this root which is to be grafted into the body of Christ, where we ask that he may lead the rest of his life according to this beginning.

Living Branches will be the result of these roots, and the watchword of Section II this year, is a "Live Branch," and our roots are its beginning. If the root be holy, so are the branches; if we plant our root in consecrated hearts we cannot but have rich fruitage in the years to come, not only for the Junior

Department and Woman's Auxiliary, but our future clergy, vestries and laymen, as we number among our Little Helpers more boys than girls.

Fifty-four Branches have sent in their gifts this year, and 10 of these are new Parishes. With these we have the boxes of Miss Hart's Circle, which number fifteen and our Special gifts, over and above all boxes, making a total of \$673.77. Mrs. North's Treasurer's Report will give particulars. Two hundred and eight of our boxes are kept in memory of little children.

The annual services for the Buffalo District and Rochester were held in St. Luke's, Rochester and St. Mary's, Buffalo, and were afternoons we all will remember. They are much alike in character with the same plan in service, flowers and music, and in each case some 16 Parishes were represented.

An addition this year was a Little Helpers' Catechism recited by mothers and children, and a song they sang when their pennies were offered.

At our Annual Meeting a question box helped to clear up many things not understood before.

The tree cannot keep on growing in beauty unless its roots are kept alive. The mothers must watch with tender interest the little ones and see that the souls of the children are as well cared for as the body and mind are to-day. These are our future home-makers, citizens, the future Missionary Society. Shall it be rooted and grounded in love for Christ?

DIRECTIONS

To Parish Treasurers:

Och.
1. Parish treasurers should send money, as usual, to the diocesan treasurer, Mrs. Potter, not later next year than Sept. 25th, as the fiscal year at the Church Missions House closes Sept. 1st, and consequently the Western New York books must close five days earlier. It will be remembered that the Board of Missions is changing its fiscal year by adding one month to each year from now, till December is reached, which will be the permanent date for closing the fiscal year.

To United Offering Treasurers:

2. Money for the United Offering must be sent to the treasurer of that offering, Mrs. Woodward. Semi-annual collections are desired, in order to secure the interest on the first payment.

To Parish Secretaries:

3. The box work assigned to this diocese for the year reaches the Corresponding Secretary in mid-summer, and is by her distributed among the Box Directresses. Write in August to the Box Directress of your district, for two or three letters stating the needs of missionaries, hospitals and schools, to choose from. The officers of the branch, or a special committee, are requested to make this choice for the fall work before the branch begins regular meetings. An early choice is always wise, and especially so now that boxes are dispatched immediately after Thanksgiving in order to be received by Christmas.

4. When your branch has "accepted" a letter—that is, undertaken the work which that letter calls for, let the Directress know at once the name and address of such letter, and the name and location of your parish. It is of the utmost importance that you should return the rejected letters to the Directress at the same time, so that she can send them out to other parishes without delay. You should also write at once to the missionary whose letter has been accepted, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom.

You should write again to the missionary as soon as the box has been dispatched, stating date of shipment and enclosing the received bill of lading; and you should also send a letter to the Directress giving the value of the box. This makes at least five letters to be written in connection with each parish box. It is always advisable to put the name and address of the sender of the box inside. The prepaid freight is always estimated as part of the value of the box. An effort is being made to send a copy of the Word of God in each box.

5. Parish Presidents are urged to appoint a Leader for each Missions Study Class, who will confer with the diocesan educational secretary about subject, text-book and method desired, and report to her promptly the results obtained, that she, in turn, may send a full report of all Missions Study pursued in the Diocese to the Church Missions House before June 1.

6. A list of the officers of each parish branch should be sent to the District Secretary, for publication in the Manual, not later than November 1st. (A *type-written* list would be considered a special favor by the Secretary.)

7. If delegates to the annual or semi-annual meetings, find, after their names have been sent in, that they are unable to attend, they are requested to notify the head of the hospitality committee immediately, if necessary by telegraph, thus making room for others and preventing unnecessary confusion.
