DISTRICTS OF THE DIOCESE

The Diocese is divided into six districts, each district under a secretary appointed by the president, and each with its box-directress to whom parish secretaries apply for work.

The objects of this division are a quickening of Auxiliary life, all over the Diocese, through reaching parishes far from the customary centres, and holding there such meetings as may give them the information and inspiration that come from Diocesan meetings, also through the establishment of a system of administration equally applicable to conditions of work in village, town or city.

The aim of the Woman's Auxiliary is to occupy every parish that is willing to do something for missions in this organized way.

The division is made as far as possible according to counties. Railroad connections, however, make it impossible to follow boundaries arbitrarily.

The six districts are as follows:

BUFFALO DISTRICT: Angola, Buffalo, East Aurora, Lancaster, Lockport, Medina, Williamsville, Middleport, Niagara Falls, North Tonawanda, Gowanda, Depew and Youngstown. (Erie and Niagara Counties.)

ROCHESTER DISTRICT: Rochester, Brockport, Charlotte, Pittsford, Fairport, Scottsville, Union Hill, Sodus, Wolcott, Albion, Holley, Honeoye Falls, Spencerport. (Monroe and Orleans Counties.)

GENESEO DISTRICT: Geneseo, Avon, Dansville, Mount Morris, Batavia, LeRoy, Oakfield, Warsaw, Stafford, Perry, Caledonia. (Livingston, Wyoming, and Genesee Counties.)

GENEVA DISTRICT: Canandaigua, Clifton Springs, Shortsville, Phelps, Geneva, Palmyra, Lyons, Clyde, Newark, Dresden, Penn Yan, Branchport, Himrods, Dundee. (Wayne, Ontario and Yates Counties.)

BATH DISTRICT: Bath, Canaseraga, Corning, Hammondsport, Hornell, Addison, Catharine, Montour Falls, Watkins. (Steuben and Schuyler Counties.)

OLEAN DISTRICT: Olean, Salamanca, Mayville, Chautauqua, Angelica, Dunkirk, Fredonia, Jamestown, Westfield, Belmont, Belvidere, Ripley, Ellicottville, Cuba, Silver Creek, Wellsville. (Chautauqua, Cattaraugus and Allegany Counties.)

A LETTER FROM
THE PRESIDENT OF THE AUXILIARY

My Fellow-Workers:

As this Manual goes to press I add a few words to you about the development of our work. I find, in studying a file of our Manuals, that we have advanced about \$4,000 in our gifts in the last ten years; that is to say, we are giving this year over \$16,000 where we gave \$12,000 ten years ago. It is a serious task to raise such an amount regularly; many givers are needed to accomplish it. And now we shall have to carry on our work side by side with the earnest and imperative claims of the war work. We shall not find it easy. I think we can be faithful to our obligations to the missionary work of the Church, and also be efficient in our patriotic duties during the war, only by personal sacrifice, and by a very conscientious and careful planning of our time and our money.

Many lives are being remodeled on lines that give more time for Red Cross work; and that change should leave undisturbed the time and money which we are in the habit of giving to our Auxiliary work. Should Bishop Brent be with us at our June meeting in Palmyra, as I hope, let us show him that we have been true to our responsibilities this winter.

The many supplications for blessings on our work that have ascended to the Throne of Grace during the Pilgrimage of Prayer, just closed, must surely bring a quickening of the spiritual life that is the foundation of all our labors.

REPORT OF THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY

1916-1917

The present year has been one of stirring events in which the women of this diocese have taken their full share, and with all the unusual demands made upon them have carried on the missionary work with their accustomed faithfulness.

On October 8th and 9th, 1916, the thirty-sixth annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held in Trinity Church, Buffalo. All the sections were well represented and the meeting was the largest on record. Wednesday was, as usual, the day set apart for the Juniors. It was a gala day for the Little Helpers, for with Miss Mary Hart as the central figure the twenty-fifth anniversary was celebrated. A generous bag of silver, presented at the luncheon hour, was the outward manifestation of interest in this infant mission of the Church.

In the afternoon, Mrs. Berry held a large model class and brought to her hearers the inspiration from the St. Louis Triennial.

On Wednesday evening the missionary service was held at Trinity Church. Bishop Walker was unable to be present but sent a letter which was read by the rector, the Reverend Cameron J. Davis. Mr. Davis also made an address of welcome. The other speakers were Bishop Colmore of Porto Rico and the Rev. Dr. Harding.

On Thursday morning Bishop Colmore was the celebrant at the Communion Service.

The business meeting was held in the chapel and was the largest on record. There were fifty-three parishes represented with one hundred and eighty delegates. The annual reports showed that splendid work had been done in the diocese during the past year. Miss Lucy Arnold brought, as usual, a message of encouragement and uplift. The Juniors, after their reports had been given, presented Miss Alice M. Larery of St. Mary's, Buffalo, who had offered her services as a missionary, to be sent wherever most needed. Miss Cramer of Rochester (St. Paul's), has also enrolled her name among the missionaries.

Mrs. Nicholas spoke in a most enthusiastic manner of the wonderful influence of the St. Louis Triennial, and asked for the interest of all present in the messages brought from there. When the pledges were renewed this interest manifested itself in the ratification of the new pledges accepted. A pledge of \$100 was made for St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, Japan, and a \$25.00 pledge to the little church at Anvik, Alaska. Two short addresses were made at this business meeting. Mr. Davis spoke of the Apportionment Plan and thanked the women of the Auxiliary for their share in the work. Bishop Colmore again spoke of his work in Porto Rico. He asked for personal interest in the lay readers who were workers with him in this important field.

On May 2d the Woman's Auxiliary lost a friend who always had their interests deeply at heart. Bishop Walker, from his first meeting with the Auxiliary to the last time he was present, at Westfield, in May, 1916, attended

the meetings whenever possible and was always ready with words of encouragement and cheer.

Our president, Mrs. Nicholas, and many Auxiliary friends were present at the beautiful last service held at St. Paul's Church, Buffalo.

At the semi-annual meeting in Canandaigua resolutions of sympathy were drawn. In these resolutions, a copy of which was sent to Mrs. Walker, the women of the Auxiliary expressed in earnest words their sorrow at the loss of their beloved Bishop and friend.

The semi-annual meeting was held at St. John's Church, Canandaigua, on June 13th and 14th. It was a doubly interesting meeting for it was the centennial year of St. John's Parish. The church and guild-house had been beautified for this centennial celebration. One hundred and thirty-two delegates were present, representing thirty-four parishes. The speakers at the Wednesday evening service were the Rector, the Rev. Herbert L. Gaylord, Ph.D., the Rev. Charles D. Broughton of Ascension Church, Buffalo, and the Rev. R. W. Andrews of Japan.

On Thursday morning, after the Communion Service, the business meeting was held. Detailed reports of the year's work were given by the Secretary and Treasurer, the Educational Secretary, the Treasurer of the United Offering, the Church Periodical Club, the Comfort Club and the Box Directresses—all encouraging.

On April 13th the Officers' Conference was held in Buffalo, at the residence of Mrs. Nathaniel Rochester, the Buffalo officers being the hostesses. The meeting had been postponed on account of a serious accident which had befallen the president. It was with more than pleasure that Mrs. Nicholas was welcomed in apparent perfect health, due to her indomitable courage.

At this meeting was considered Miss Delafield's letter with "Suggestions for the Organization of the Woman's Auxiliary," meaning a *general* organization. This was considered as fully as the time permitted, and it was finally agreed that we should not refuse to join in a provincial, and also in a general organization (provided they do not interfere in any way with diocesan authority), to the end that the Woman's Auxiliary might be in a position to share more fully in the work of the Board of Missions, if desired, either as an advisory board or as members of the Board of Missions itself. The decision reached thus tentatively, at the Conference, was formally confirmed at the semi-annual meeting in Canandaigua, by putting the matter to a vote.

A special appeal was made to assist the Rev. Charles H. Evans with the building of a church at Akita, Japan. Miss Esther Smith pledged two hundred dollars toward this fund if \$300 more could be raised, making \$500 in all. After consideration each diocesan officer was asked to make herself responsible for ten dollars. It was believed that the whole auxiliary, at its annual meeting, would provide the remainder.

This year "The Pilgrimage of Prayer," a custom brought from England, was instituted for the first time in this country. The plan was somewhat changed. Instead of pilgrimages, a week of prayer for each diocese was arranged, thus forming a chain of prayer-weeks around the world. The year closes at Advent. Sunday, November the 25th, is to be set aside for a Corporate Communion Service. On this day all the members of the Woman's Auxiliary are asked to

meet in their parishes and offer prayers for the missionaries of their Church, for the men serving their country, and for peace.

The Box Work has never been more necessary than this year, judging from the appeals that have come from the missionary districts. The amount in figures is most satisfactory, and splendid boxes have gone from this diocese. Seventeen family-boxes were recorded, of which the total value was \$2,704.82. Twenty-two missions were helped, the sum totaling \$3,618.31. There were three joint boxes, one to Valle Crucis, N. C.; another to the Training School at La Grange, Georgia, and a third to the Hendersonville Associate Missions, Hendersonville, N. C. The sum total is \$6,323.11.

Everywhere is heard the call to service. Let us remember that we can best serve our God and our country by doing the duties set before us faithfully and well. One of these duties is the upholding of our missionaries who are laborers on the frontiers.

REPORT OF THE DIOCESAN EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

To the President and Members of the Woman's Auxiliary of Western New York:

The course on Latin America which the Educational Department planned for our use during 1916-17 has proved most timely. We have watched with more intelligent interest the attitude of the South American Republics toward the warring nations; the policy of Church and State toward Haiti; our wise conduct in our dealings with Cuba. We have learned anew to regard with admiration the wonderful civilization and government of the Incas and their child-like faith in a Supreme Father, and to respect the spirit which caused the Friars to give their lives willingly in performing their duty as they conceived it.

Those of you who have, for some reason, failed to avail yourselves of the opportunities so generously provided by the Educational Department, have missed the joy and profit of our concerted work—but it is still yours to take up by yourselves—if only as Reading Circles—the intensely interesting text-book—The New World—with its collateral reading, and gain knowledge, inspiration and courage for the strenuous days that are upon us.

From a purely selfish standpoint it is the subject we should become more familiar with, for while Europe is in a state of upheaval we must turn our eyes to the South, and when the time is ripe our sons will seek their fortunes in its rich countries, the valleys of whose rivers can furnish bread for the world—whose mountains are bursting with mineral wealth. Then if we follow those dear sons with their heritage of the Church in which they were nurtured the new civilization of Latin America will be the glory of the world. If we neglect the opportunity it will be dreadful to confront the materialistic civilization which will sink to the degradation of the present corrupt social and ecclesiastical code.

I beg of you to read or study collectively or individually, Dr. Gray's book this summer. Next year we are asked to consider other subjects so we must move on—halting is stagnation—and there was never more need in the Church for activity and progress, as well as for the wise guidance which comes from experience to temper the enthusiasm which carries us too swiftly. The Rev. Dr. Gray who has wisely directed the Educational work for several years has been moved to another department on the Board. Dr. Gray has always given courteous attention and sympathetic aid to his Diocesan Secretaries and we are grateful to him. We welcome his successor, Dr. William C. Sturgis, who is devoting his enthusiastic energy to the work.

We have lost the head of all our Diocesan work, whose sympathy and love were always ours—whose engagements were made to fit our general meetings and our Conference of Officers—whose home was the hospitable center for our deliberations—whose heart and mind were ever open to our interests. In the passing of our beloved Bishop and friend we are indeed like children bereft.

Truly the old order changeth and from my view-point of nearly 20 years in this department of our work I foresee new and different methods. Let us hope that their development may be strong and their usefulness world-wide.

SUMMARY. We have had reported in the Diocese 57 groups for study this winter, whose work was classified under the heads of *Classes, Reading Circles, Mission Study or Program Missionary Meetings, and Normal Classes.* A, B, C, D. I am always glad when I can assign a group to the first class for it spells earnest work. There was a Normal Class at our Annual Meeting, one at a meeting of the Buffalo District and one for the Rochester District. A Conference of Leaders for the Buffalo District was said to be most helpful.

Many groups used the Lantern Lectures loaned by the Educational Department. In the use of these in the Geneva District a class of Presbyterian women studying Latin America was invited to share our pictures.

A member of one class became so interested in Porto Rico that she wrote a friend residing there urging her to offer her services to Bishop Colmore.

A father, within hearing of the reading of a group of his daughter's friends gathered for Mission Study of the New World, became so interested that he asked for the book and read it. A weekly black-board summary of the lesson was a feature of one splendid class. A cut out map covered all ground, pasted on cloth, showing Spain, Southern United States, islands, Central and South Americas. Spanish flags put in as conquered and taken off and national flag put on as independent.

In several groups men were included and in one parish the leader again organized the Senior and Junior Brotherhood of St. Andrew into classes, and the Junior Branch gave a dramatization of Manana. Impersonations were the special features of several groups. Meetings at the homes of different members were popular and some groups chose a different leader for each meeting. One group closed each meeting by an extempore prayer by a member.

I wish to speak of the wonderful helpfulness of the District Educational secretaries in Buffalo and Rochester. If one woman in each of our six Districts would volunteer to devote herself to this important work it would grow apace. So far only three Districts have their appointed secretaries—and I am hampered in reporting completely the work of the other Districts because of the disregard of the appeal for a report of work done.

We have been interested in a practical way in the appeal for \$1000 to make Mr. Droste's school in Porto Rico ours. Dr. Gray told me some time ago that it was in sight. Western New York responded generously.

This is briefly the story of our educational work for 1917. May the coming years show deeper interest, broader knowledge and more beneficent results to our neighbors to the south of us because of our imperfect efforts.

Let us continue to use daily the prayer which we adopted this year for our department of the work—

"Take our minds, O Lord, and think through them;
Take our lips, O Lord, and speak through them;
Take our hearts, O Lord, and fill them with love for Thee and Thy work."

CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB

This is the way a missionary who has only had books at Christmas-time feels about the Church Periodical Club. "The work of your club may appear very small among the many urgent works which engage the energies of the Church people; but they could not persist in such an opinion did they know how much pleasure you give the recipients of your gifts."

During the year we have sent regularly: 451 current periodicals, (329 contributors of current periodicals), 1 Prayer Book, 1 Hymnal, 6 Theological and secular books, 2 Tracts and catechisms, 1865 old magazines and papers, 557 Christmas and Easter cards, 672 picture cards and calendars, 2 sets of paper dolls, 10 boxes and 2 barrels of magazines.

Six institutions in the Diocese aided. Lib. 22 also sent books that were especially asked for to St. Paul's College, Tokyo, Japan; to Boone Preparatory School, Wuchang, China, and to Fairbanks, Alaska. Mrs. Walker sent books from the Bishop's library to Anchorage, Alaska; also twenty-six theological books to the Central office.

Christmas will soon be here and we are again asked for Christmas cards. Mr. Snavely of Cuba asks for picture postals, which he likes to carry in his pocket and give to the little ones who cannot speak our language but who can always enjoy a picture. Bishop and Mrs. Walker gave your correspondent a number of beautiful Christmas cards. This little story illustrates the appreciation of one of the recipients. A woman living in a little cabin, off in the hills, with none of the comforts of life, on being asked how she bore the loneliness said, "I am not alone and do not feel lonely," adding —as she pointed to the picture of our Lord, "He is ever with me."

We were asked this summer to help the Chaplains in the Army and Navy. Many of our librarians have responded to the call, and are sending papers and periodicals regularly. One of our Chaplains writes, "Anything which helps to keep our men in efficient condition, morally as well as physically, against the hour of need, is true patriotism, and those who assist you in your work are truly doing their bit" In Rochester they are supporting the Chaplain's Welfare Work. Yet the pressure of war conditions also falls heavily upon our people in the remote missions; so let us not withdraw anything from them in seeking after a new thing. We look to you who have helped us in the past with gratitude and with confidence to enlarge and further our work in the future.

REPORT OF SECTION THREE OF JUNIOR AUXILIARY

In looking back upon the Intermediate work of the past year, two things stand out so full of promise and encouragement that we want to put them first in our account of the year's efforts. The first is, that we have two Volunteers—Miss Alice Larery of St. Mary's-on-the-Hill, Buffalo, now in Fort Hall, Idaho, and Miss Martha Cramer of St. Paul's, Rochester, a teacher in Miss Ashurst's school, in Cuba, both of them former Juniors. What a satisfaction it is that we are responding more adequately to the call for laborers, and what a promise it holds of future achievements!

Our second encouragement is that every District has been reached by an Institute, or series of special classes for Leaders. Four Institutes were held, in Rochester, Canandaigua, Olean and Corning, Buffalo having had the classes of Miss Crosby and Dr. Jefferys.

There have been twenty-two Study Classes, in eighteen parishes, Manana, the New World, and the Bible being the text-books most generally used.

The work of the Prayer Committee has been most helpful. A Leaflet of Thanksgiving and Intercession was prepared and distributed among Junior Leaders and members. Some part was taken in the Pilgrimage of Prayer; in Buffalo Dr. Jefferys conducting the service for both Leaders and Older Girls. A Leaders' Prayer Group has been an outcome of this.

Twenty-six branches have reported work this year. Two have graduated into the Woman's Auxiliary, two have been received from Section Two, four branches have sent in no report. We have two new branches, at Niagara Falls and St. Thomas, Rochester.

At this beginning of the new year we welcome to our Junior staff, Mrs. Benjamin Chace of St. Paul's, Rochester, as Diocesan Head of the Older Girls. We have given, this year, to our Scholarships \$227.95, to the United Offering \$145.96, reported only \$26.15, to District and Diocesan expenses \$58.37, to Dean Lobdell's nurse \$139.36, to St. Agnes', Kyoto \$40.35. Other Specials have been as follows: to St. Agnes', Anking, by the Rochester branches \$27.50, to the Church General Hospital, Wuchang, by the members of Miss Crosby's Class, Buffalo, \$50.00, to St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, by the members of Dr. Jeffery's class, Buffalo, \$25.00, to the Alice Lord Bed, Elizabeth Bunn Memorial Hospital, Wuchang, by Older Girl Leaders and friends, \$50.00. \$10.00, reported only, was sent to Rev. Mr. Evans, Akita, Japan, and \$5.00 to Bishop Rowe. The Box work has amounted to \$380.20, making a total giving of \$1,185.64.

Our Watchword for the year is "Loyalty," our motto, "Be ye steadfast," and we rejoice that in this hour of the world's need we have as the goal of all our efforts, that which alone can make a Christian, war-less world, the extending of the sway of Jesus Christ in the hearts and lives of men.

In closing, we feel that we have made but a beginning in the working out of the Sunday School-Junior Plan, which is so full of possibilities for the child-life of the Church. At a recent meeting with the Diocesan Board of Religious Education their cordial approval was secured, to be expressed in an open letter to the Church School and Junior authorities, and the appointment of two members to serve on a Joint Committee for furthering the plan, Rev.

J. W. D. Cooper and Mr. Harper Sibley being their representatives. We earnestly ask the interest and co-operation of the Senior Auxiliary in our efforts.

SECTION II

“For without Me ye can do nothing.”

The word “deepening” seems best to express the gains in the Section II of the Junior Department. During the past year our watchword was “More Prayer” and the results seem to prove that we have indeed “worked with” the Master in a special sense this year. We have given more of material things than ever before and also the gift of lives.

Miss Larery, who has gone to Fort Hall, Idaho, has been identified specially with Section II of the Junior Department in Buffalo for several years, and now we feel that we are united to the work in the field in a special way. Miss Cramer, too, in Cuba, though she perhaps belongs more specially to Section III, gives us another link to the field.

We can report only 53 branches this year where we reported 56 last year but this loss is only apparent. We have five lapsed branches, but we have one new branch in Pittsford, one in St. John’s Mission in Rochester, with four revived—St. Clement’s, Holy Communion, and St. Philip’s, Buffalo, and Palmyra. Two branches, one in St. Paul’s, Rochester, and Angelica, have passed on to Section III, while in four parishes the same number of Juniors are working in one branch where last year they were reported as two.

Pledges this year amounted to \$336.55, box-work to \$643.30 and United offerings to \$60.77, a total gain of \$182.26 over last year. Specials given by parishes to Mr. Mason, Mission Home, Va. \$12.00. to St. Agnes’ School, Kyoto \$26.50, to Valle Crucis \$6.25, a total of \$48.25, besides special gifts of Juniors to Mr. Evan’s work in Japan, of \$230.00. Parishes also report \$23.27 for social service work. Boxes were sent to Whirlwind, Oklahoma, Crow Creek Mission, Fort Thompson, S. D., to Ponce and to Mr. Droste at Manite, Porto Rico, Cape Mount, Africa, St. John’s, Ketchikan, St. Paul’s School and Franklin Associate Mission. Thirty-six Mission study classes, mostly in Manana, are reported.

Special mention should be made of the monthly meetings of leaders in Buffalo and Rochester Districts for prayer and conference, also of the Institute held in Rochester, Canandaigua, Corning and Olean. Both were so successful that they will be continued this year.

“Loyalty” is our watchword for next year, and our motto “Be ye steadfast.” Never have we had such an opportunity to bring home to our Juniors the need of loyalty in all things. May we be faithful to our trust.

LITTLE HELPERS' REPORT 1917

Loyalty we marked upon the Little Helpers letters at Whitsuntide. *Loyalty* to the Banner of Christ under which we promised to fight faithfully to our life's end when we were baptized. *Loyalty* to our country is the subject on every mind now. Now comes our opportunity to stand for the three principles held by the Little Helpers Society since the foundation twenty-six years ago—baptism, consecration of gifts and systematic giving. To my great delight *Loyalty* was chosen as the watchword for the II and III Sections at the Officer's Meeting in September, so the Junior Society all have one aim this new year and we are called to take a new place in the church's life.

For many years we were a department of the Woman's Auxiliary and how tenderly they cared for us all those twenty-two years; but in 1913 at the General Convention we were made a Section of the Junior Department and we have tried to be faithful to that trust but now we are called to a new position by the Religious Board of Education to widen the work of Missions through the Sunday School; and to the new plans we must be *loyal* as to those of the past, but never giving up our three foundation principles. The Font Roll of the Sunday School must reach out its hand that we may welcome each other into Christ's work for His little children. The two hold the same principles and should work together. *Loyalty* to Christ, *loyalty* to our past principles and *loyalty* to the new plans of 1918 will require grave thoughts and faithful prayers to hold to our beautiful past and try to be in sympathy with the present effort to extend Missions in the church.

I am only going to speak of two things that stand for our year's work, as Mrs. Noeth will tell you the rest in her Treasurer's Report. The gift of \$1,000 to be made in 1919 by the Little Helpers has reached in one year

\$925 with thirty dioceses yet to hear from. Western New York's part has been sent in and amounted to \$111. For eighteen years we have sent a Font in the diocese that cost \$26.90. This year because of the high cost of marble it was \$8.07 more and this has been given me by some good friends and some offerings that came too late for the Whitsuntide Report. May I thank every member of the Auxiliary in all its departments for their continued sympathy and love and *loyalty* to the Little Helpers for all these years and to their leaders. God has indeed blessed our work in a wonderful way, and now we must begin again; for our dear Bishop Walker is not with us now who has been such a loyal friend and helper, and many changes must now come to us all, but Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.

1. Parish treasurers should send money, as usual, to the diocesan treasurer, Mrs. Potter, not later than Oct. 25th, as our fiscal year closes Nov. 1st.

To United Offering Treasurers:

2. Money for the United Offering must be sent to the treasurer of that offering, Mrs. Woodward. Semi-annual collections are desired, in order to secure the interest on the first payment.

To Parish Secretaries:

(Mrs. Nathaniel Rochester, of Buffalo, the corresponding secretary, is at the head of this work.)

3. The box work assigned to this diocese for the year reaches the Corresponding Secretary in mid-summer, and is by her distributed among the Box Directresses. Write in August to the Box Directress of your district, for two or three letters, stating the needs of missionaries, hospitals and schools, to choose from. The officers of the branch, or a special committee, are requested to make this choice for the fall work before the branch begins regular meetings. An early choice is always wise, and especially so now that boxes are dispatched immediately after Thanksgiving in order to be received by Christmas.

4. When your branch has "accepted" a letter—that is, undertaken the work which that letter calls for, let the Directress know at once the name and address of such letter, and the name and location of your parish. It is of the utmost importance that you should return the rejected letters to the Directress at the same time, so that she can send them out to other parishes without delay. You should also write at once to the missionary whose letter has been accepted, stating when he may expect a box, and from whom.

You should write again to the missionary as soon as the box has been dispatched, stating the date of shipment and enclosing the receipted bill of lading; and you should also send a letter to the Directress giving the value of the box. This makes at least five letters to be written in connection with each parish box. It is always advisable to put the name and address of the sender of the box inside and also *outside* the box. The prepaid freight is always estimated as part of the value of the box. An effort is being made to send a copy of the Word of God in each box.

5. A type-written list of the officers of each parish branch should be sent to the District Secretary, for publication in the Manual, not later than November 1st.

6. If delegates to the annual or semi-annual meetings, find, after their names have been sent in, that they are unable to attend, they are requested to notify the head of the hospitality committee immediately, if necessary by telegraph, thus making room for others and preventing unnecessary confusion.

7. Parish Presidents are urged to appoint a Leader for each Missions Study Class, who will confer with the diocesan educational secretary about subject, text-book and method desired, and report to her promptly the results obtained; that she, in turn, may send a full report of all Missions Study pursued in the Diocese to the Church Missions House before June 1.

CONSTITUTION

I

The name of this Society shall be "The Western New York Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions."

II

The object of this Society is, by means of union and systematic effort, to diffuse missionary intelligence, to increase missionary activity among women of the Diocese, to unite previously existing societies, and encourage the formation of societies where there are none.

III

All parish societies, and all individuals desiring it, will be considered members of this Society.

IV

The officers of this Society shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a United Offering Treasurer, and two Secretaries, Corresponding and Recording, chosen by the Diocesan Association at the annual meeting and approved by the Bishop.

V

The President, or in her necessary absence, one of the Vice-Presidents, shall call meetings and preside over them.

VI

The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and prepare a report to be read at the annual meeting. The Recording Secretary shall give notice of meetings, keep the minutes, and prepare a manual for circulation in the Diocese.

VII

The Treasurer shall take charge of all money belonging to the Society; shall keep an exact account of all receipts and disbursements, and shall make a full report of the same at each annual meeting, and oftener if required.

VIII

The members of this Society will send reports of money collected and work done to the Secretary. Delegates from the parish societies will be expected at the annual meetings.

IX

There shall be one general meeting of this Society each year, on the second Wednesday and Thursday in November.

X

During the year three or more sectional or special meetings may be called by the President, or at the request of three or more parishes. The days of said meetings shall be Wednesday or Thursday.

XI

This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting.
