Program of Prayer, Study, Gifts, Service

*"Make us messengers of Thy grace,
Ambassadors of God amongst men,

Thou Thyself mayest enter freely

Weekly Bible Classes in every parish and mission is a goal set for this year's study. Added to this, is the mission study book for the year, "The New Africa." Thus may be achieved that "grace and knowledge" that is the need of every messenger of Christ, and Christian conviction based on Biblical knowledge on the one hand, and knowledge of the world's need, on the other.

Adult Bible Classes should be a regular part of every Church School, and the co-operation of the Auxiliary has been sought to accomplish this.

A week-day Bible Class preceding the regular Auxiliary meeting will be conducted in some parishes, as well as an evening Bible Class for business women. In smaller parishes and missions, classes composed of men and women may be more practicable than separate classes. In addition, Bible study should be offered every adult unable to attend a class through a "Home Department." This may be accomplished through the Auxiliary or the Church School. Courses are suggested under the head of "Educational Material" on the last page.

SEPTEMBER

Corporate Communion and Presentation of United Thank Offering. Visit every woman in the parish and seek out new people, including school teachers. Enlist interest in Bible study through personal work, cooperating with the rector and superintendent of Church School. The Provincial Department of Religious Education asks the cooperation of the Auxiliary in arranging a Parent-Teacher meeting for the Church School, when teachers will explain courses for each grade.

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DECEMBER

Christian Social Service Program: Grace Hospital; Emerald-Hodgson Memorial Hospital; St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, work in your parish. Cooperate with with Christmas plans for parish and community. Send greetings to Prayer Partners. Elect officers. Forward 4th quarter Gifts.

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JANUARY

Service of Installation for new officers. Appointment of Standing Committees. Invite missionaries to address parish groups. Make plans for study of Africa. Collect clippings and articles from newspapers and magazines.

As Africa is the subject of study for several other churches besides our own, a united community mission study class helps the spirit of Christian unity and community interest in missions.

Order "The New Africa" with "Suggestions for Leaders" through your District vice-president. Arrange your program for six or more classes, assigning work to different members in time for thorough preparation. Plan Lenten Box work.

FEBRUARY

February 13. Ash Wednesday. Shrive to promote the devotional life of your parish in helping others to attend Lenten services, in supplying others with devotional reading, in planning prayer groups where services cannot be frequent. Those Branches holding week-day Bible Classes will find it practicable to have the mission class follow the Bible Class. However, when this is done, there should be two leaders, well prepared, so that the session may not be too long. Help forward the parish Easter Offering. Forward 1st quarter gifts.

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MARCH

March 25. Feast of the Annunciation: Presentation of United Thank Offering.

March 31. Easter Day. Corporate Communion of all women of the parish. Endeavor to reach every communicant with a personal message. Arrange daily Prayer services for Holy Week where there are no Church services.

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APRIL

Continue Bible Classes and missionary current events. Arrange for entire membership to attend District meeting. Forward 2nd quarter gifts to Treasurer and U. T. O. to Custodian.

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MAY

May 5. "Church Periodical Sunday." Ask your Rector to speak of the work and to use the C. P. C. Prayer. Elect three delegates and alternates to the Annual Meeting to be held at Kanuga Lake, June 11, 12, 13. Create interest in attendance on Summer Conferences and Camps. Every Branch should find means to send the Educational Secretary to one of these Conferences to prepare herself as leader of study classes.

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JUNE

Report Annual Meeting. Pay dues in advance that your Treasurer may pay all obligations on time. Visit missions and assist in mission work in your neighborhood. Let the Church help to make your vacation recreative spiritually as well as physically through study and fellowship at Kanuga or Sewanee.
