Mercifully assist us in every duty each one of us have to do, and vouchsafe to be our Companion every day from morning to night and night to morning; that we may love Thy presence and walk in it vigilantly, and, being delivered from all errors and adversities, may joyfully serve Thee in all godly quietness; through Jesus Christ our God. Amen."

### Study the Program of the Church.

Study the course on India, suggested by our National Board.

Establish library in your Church School.

Subscribe to Church papers.

Help Church Periodical Secretary distribute books and papers.  
Also help Bible Class.

Attend the Bible Class.

Attend Conferences, Teacher Training Classes and Conventions.

Plan your programs for the year in advance, concentrating on the Parish work first then going into the Community, Diocese, Nation, and World. Have outside speakers whenever it is possible. Do not overlook the fact that all education is a slow process. Remember that the purpose of all education in the Church is to make intelligent Church Members, loyal to the Leader and His Purpose for the world with all the qualities which that loyalty involves.

Let us remember there is no true program without a goal, so let our object in this Department be: the realization of the Kingdom of God, which is the Kingdom of Love, as interpreted in the life and teaching of Jesus Christ.

Subject: *Industrial Problems in North Carolina*

### 1. Relations of Employer and Employed

How has the growth of industrialism affected this relation?  
How has the growth of industrialism affected social and economic life?  
What are the underlying causes which creat situations resulting in strikes? How may strikes be prevented?  
What is the responsibility of employer to employed?  
What is the responsibility of the state to industrial relations?  
What are the state laws relating to women and children in industry?  
Workmen's compensation? Labor unions? What relation of State Department of Public Welfare to industry? What relation of compulsory education law to industry? Compare state laws with national laws affecting industrial relationships.

### 2. The Church's Relationship to Industrial Problems

What is the Church's responsibility and opportunity in industrial problems? How can we, as Christian citizens, work for the solution of these problems? What is your Church doing in mill communities?

## II. WORK

Visiting and ministering to sick, needy strangers.

Co-operation with community groups and public agencies and institutions, for health, recreation, better racial and industrial relations, unemployment, child welfare, helping to improve conditions and to raise standards in accordance with Christian ideals.

Work for better laws affecting social and industrial welfare, and for a more enlightened public opinion.

Supply books, clothing, and other needs, always working to be constructively helpful to individuals in need or emergency.

Co-operate with the diocesan and national program of the Church in carrying out their programs in the field of Christian Social Service.

Help your diocesan department by keeping records, and making statistical report of work done in your parish or mission.

The Diocesan Department will supply sources of information and other help for parish programs.
