Message of the President Of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese

TO THE WOMEN OF THE DIOCESE:

It gives me great joy to be able to say to you that the reports of 1936 show progress in every line of work and each Branch is working in the Five Fields of Service. This plainly shows that a broader vision of the work in our Heavenly Father's Kingdom is being attained.

If we would only value our membership more highly, take the obligations of that membership more seriously, and try to carry them out more cheerfully, do you not believe that others, now uninterested will feel the effects and catch the true spirit of the Woman's Auxiliary? When we can make our women realize they should put first things first in their lives then they will not only want to attend the Auxiliary but will consider it a privilege to do so.

This past summer we had a fine attendance of Auxiliary women at the Adult Conference, held at Kanuga. Let us try to increase that number next summer. What a glorious thing it would be if we could have a representative from each branch in the Diocese.

Our Provincial Meeting was held in New Orleans last November. Our Diocese was represented by its full delegation. The meeting was inspiring and instructive. One resolution, passed at that meeting, I should like to call your special attention to. It was as follows: Resolved, That the women of the Aux-

iliary be requested to join audibly in the Auxiliary Prayer whenever it is used in Services and Meetings.

Another Resolution I wish to remind you of was passed at our Annual Meeting last June. Resolved: That the members of the Auxiliary take back to their Branches the plan of having a prayer for peace at each Auxiliary Meeting.

In our daily prayers let us remember the missionaries that are our Prayer Partners, Miss Lona Weatherly at Creswell, N. C., and Miss Grace West Brady, care American Church Mission, Shanghai, China.

This past year we have given liberally, which of course represents our service since we all cannot serve in the Mission Field. Figures are tiresome, but I must give you some: Our budget for 1936 was paid in full. The Advance Work Offering amounted to \$169.95; the United Thank Offering \$1,350.43; our Supply Boxes \$316.90; and for special gifts \$1,191.18. All of this last amount was spent in our own Parishes and Communities.

This year we are looking forward to the Triennial, that is, our General Convention of the whole Church. It is to meet in Cincinnati, Ohio, next October. We must think of the delegates we are to send, who will be elected at our Annual Meeting next June. Please remember this meeting in your prayers so that we may have God's guidance in our selection of these delegates.

In closing I will ask you to pray during the coming year that we may grow, day by day, in the knowledge and love of God, and His Son, Jesus Christ.
