: It is and 's custom each year on the anniversary to re-affirm the vows they made at their wedding in 1999. Today on the 10th anniversary of that occasion, we will begin by witnessing their re-affirmation of those promises.

: Ten years ago, and had what they called a Covenant Service at In every sense but legal, that was the beginning of their marriage. Now the State of Iowa has made it possible for them to marry legally; so, in a sense, today we will be completing the service that happened 10 years ago. It was important to them then, and is important to them now, that these services take place in a context that integrates their faith and their relationship.

And so, we will now hear two of the Scripture lessons used at that original covenant service.

reads Psalm 139:1-13

O God, you have searched me out and known me; you know my sitting down and my rising up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You trace my journeys and my resting-places and are acquainted with all my ways. Indeed, there is not a word on my lips, but you, O God, know it altogether. You press upon me behind and before and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain to it. Where can I go then from your Spirit? where can I flee from your presence? If I climb up to heaven, you are there; if I make the grave my bed, you are there also. If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, Even there your hand will lead me and your right hand hold me fast. If I say, "Surely the darkness will cover me, and the light around me turn to night," Darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day; darkness and light to you are both alike. For you yourself created my inmost parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I will thank you because I am marvelously made; your works are wonderful, and I know it well.

reads Colossians 3:12-17
